HON. W. S. FIELDING

Our citizens will no doubt give a warm welcome to Hon. W. S. Fielding, who in company with Mr. Marcell, M. P., will address the electors of Charlottetown this evening in the Arena Rink. Mr. Fielding stands not lower than second in the cabinet in point of ability and influence, having been almost solid Province of Nova Scotia at his back. He is full of information and has a clear, convincing and persuasive manner of placing his facts and arguments before the people. More than any other and without exception he is regarded as the best friend this Island Province has in the cabinet. Beyond this he is a very pleasant gentleman to meet and one whose private life is and has been always above reproach. Our people will not soon forget that it was to Mr. Fielding we are indebted for the reduced telegraph tolls and he might service by wire that we are now enjoying.

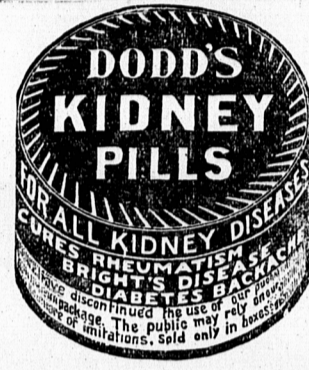
For all these reasons intelligent citizens of both parties will listen with attention and interest to what Mr. Fielding has to say tonight and note it closely.

There is some feeling that an undue share of the expenditure is made in the West. Vast sums have been expended to give transportation improvements on the mainland in the way of railways and canals, and for immigration, and vast new works like the Transcontinental Railway, the Hudson Bay Railway, the Georgian Bay Canal, and a new Welland Canal are either now in construction, or promised, or projected. None of these are likely to benefit Prince Edward Island in any way. Not that our people object to needful works of expenditure anywhere. For all such they will cheerfully pay their share. What they object to is that while so much is done to give cheap and easy transport to all sections on the mainland, we are still left to bear unjust and unreasonable through rates, and are sometimes holly cut off in winter for two months at a time from shipping connection with the rest of Canada and the outside world.

These matters are regarded by the people of Prince Edward Island as of a vastly more consequence than any are party differences. They have often been brought to the notice of Parliament. In the most earnest and friendly spirit we bring these matters of our winter connection and unjust freight rates before the Minister of Finance, believing that he is fair-minded and not unfriendly. This Province has waited long for an adequate remedy for the grievances complained of. Are we not entitled to a frank statement from the Minister whether we have or have not anything to hope for in that regard from his Government, and if anything, what is to be done, and when will it be done? Thousands believe the Tunnel will be the only solution. It was almost promised to us seventeen years ago by Sir Wilfrid Laurier. Much has been done and great new works are now promised to the West. What is in store for Prince Edward Island?

It is not often that our City is honored with the presence of two Governors at the Exhibition opening as it will be to-day. Governor Fraser of Nova Scotia, who is a guest at Government House, and is well and favorably known here from his previous visits, will be present and speak at the opening today.

With the opening of the Exhibition our citizens are again confronted with a lot of cheap shows, games and competitions on Queen Square. This is regrettable. In the opinion of our best citizens the little money received by the city for licenses affords no sufficient compensation for the loss of prestige and dignity suffered by having such questionable amusements going on in the heart of the city. Moreover the money taken in by these imported adventurers goes outside the Province instead of to our merchants. If the licenses already issued cannot be recalled they certainly should not be repeated in the future.
