GERMANS STILL BATTERING AT FORTS OF VERDUN

The Game at this Point is in the Hands of the French who are Apparently Inviting German Attacks all of which are being Repulsed with Fearful Losses to the Enemy.

(Special to the Guardian.) PARIS, April 11.—There was a cessation of German infantry assaults to the west of the Meuse to-day although the bombardment of French lines between Le Mort Homme and Cumleres continued, according to an official report tonight.

PROCEEDINGS IN LEGISLATURE

Tile Drainage Bill Introduced. Public Accounts and Reports of Department of Public Works and Agriculture Tabled.

PROCEEDINGS IN THE HOUSE OF COMMONS

Railway Estimates Tabled and the Usual Grievances are Registered. Guysboro Railway and Mr. Pugsley in the Limelight.

(From Our Own Correspondent.) OTTAWA, April 11.—Consideration of the railway estimates tonight brought the annual registration of grievances by the Opposition members from the Maritime Provinces. These grievances were of all sorts but pretty much on the same plane, a fair example being the complaint by Mr. E. M. MacDonald that a wooden station had been constructed somewhere in his constituency instead of a more substantial and imposing building.
