Steel, Dominion Foundries, Canadian Car and Hamilton Bridge. Trade in Naybob featured the golds. It advanced 2 1-2 cents to close at 24 cents while accounting for better than 40 per cent of the share turnover. God's Lake also was active and higher by 3 cents. Gainers in the higher-priced group were Buffalo-Ankerite, Kerr-Addison, Pioneer and LaMaque. East Malartic, Pamour, Sigma and O'Brien finished the session with light losses.

International Nickel weakened 1-2 to close at 45. Smelters lost 1-2. Falconbridge 20 cents and Ventures 5.

Western oil shares closed in a mild display of weakness and the index recorded a decline of .54. Home Oil fell back 9 cents to 2.38. Calgary-Edmonton lost 3 and Calmont 2. Okalta firmed a cent.

BRITAIN CALLING FOR B. C. LUMBER. VICTORIA, Dec. 2—(CP)—A new market in Britain for round-wood timbers from British Columbia has been opened up because of the war, according to information received by the provincial bureau of industrial trade and extension.

The bureau is working on a number of inquiries for these products, which include cottonwood logs for veneer purposes, lathwood and pit props, chiefly imported before the war from Baltic countries.

R. S. O'Meara, departmental officer, said the specifications were cabled from London by Douglas Roe, British Columbia timber commissioner, who said new sources of supply are of immediate concern to British importers seeking materials for mines and bomb shelters.

GERMANS GASED BY OWN POISON. LONDON, Dec. 2—(CP)—Writing to The Times of the recent charges by Germany that Britain supplied Poland with poison gas, J. E. Edmonds suggested the affected German soldiers might have been victims of their own weapons. To support his argument the correspondent writes: "I have been able to put my hand on the recently published second volume of the German Official Medical History of 1914-1918. It contains several mentions of the casualties suffered by German troops from German gas, e. g., on March 21, 1918, when notoriously gas blew back on the Germans. 'The 16th Reserve Division had 980 cases of gas poisoning from German mustard gas,' and the number of cases of supposed gas sickness was very great."

SUGAR IS UP IN OLD EIRE. DUBLIN, Dec. 2—(CP)—Sugar prices have been raised here from 3d (about 5 1-2 cents) a pound to 4 1-2d (about eight cents) and restrictions on the quantities purchased have been removed. Owing to refusal of beet-growing farmers to raise the full crop this year it has been necessary to import sugar. Next year, the farmers are to be guaranteed a higher price for beets and plans have been made to grow an extra 25,000 acres. This has four sugar factories and 60,000 acres of beets are required to make the state independent of outside supplies.
