**RUSSIAN MECHANICS FAVORED**

VLADIVOSTOK, May 30.—The universities of Russia, including that at Vladivostok, now have facilities for the higher education of workmen.

The idea is to make engineers and other technical professional men out of mechanics. The best salaries paid are higher than in any of the other faculties. The classes are held in the evening, so as to give the workers engaged in the different government factories and workshops a chance to attend.

**SCHOOL FOR PRISONERS STARTED AT MAIDSTONE**

MAIDSTONE, Kent, May 30.—Education on a large scale is being organized for the prisoners in the jail here.

Classes in French, shorthand and bookkeeping have already been started by the director of education for the county at the request of the prison commissioners. There are 18 prisoners in the French class, 27 in the shorthand class and seven in the bookkeeping class.

Additional classes in engineering and Spanish are being formed, the teachers giving their services voluntarily.

**PEASANTS DISTRUST BANKS**

BELGRADE, Yugoslavia, May 30.—There is today in Yugoslavia a scarcity of bank notes of large denominations, and earthen jugs. The peasants are hoarding the former and hiding them away in the latter.

The peasants' bank is a jagged, very rich in the last few years their paper money accumulations, buried in the ground as they used to hide copper and silver coin before the war, were eaten up by mice and rats. Now the peasants have learned to put their paper money in tightly corked jugs, hence the scarcity of jugs. When possible the peasants obtain banknotes of large denominations for hoarding purposes, as the jugs are too quickly filled with small value bills.

**BANKS PAY PEKING POLICE TO FORESTALL WAGE STRIKE**

PEKING, May 30.—To prevent a strike of metropolitan police, whose pay is five months in arrears, the native banks of the capital have subscribed half a million dollars as a loan to the ministry of finance which is said to have admitted its inability to hold out any hope of relief for the city guardians.

Representatives of the banks, guilds and commercial institutions are agitating for a reorganization of the police force with a view to removing control from the central government and providing a more stable source of revenue for their pay.

**HOLSTEIN COW ASSOCIATION TO MEET IN CLEVELAND JUNE 6**

CLEVELAND, May 30.—The thirty-eighth annual convention of the Holstein association of America will be held here June 6.

The first herd books of the association showed 270 registered Holsteins. Today there are more than a million animals registered in these books. In the last year 113,772 registrations were made.

High records of production have been made by 95,000 cows, under the supervision of agricultural colleges, admitting them to the advanced registry. Sixty-seven Holsteins have produced more than 1,000 pounds of butterfat in one year.

**GEDDES' AFFECTION MUCH EXAGGERATED**

WASHINGTON, May 28.—Sir Auckland Geddes, the British ambassador, is confined to a darkened room at the embassy with a serious affliction of the left eye. He is being treated by Dr. William Holland Wilmer, an eye specialist, and is under orders to give his eyes a rest for several weeks. This, however, it was stated at the embassy tonight, would not interfere with the signing of important documents the debt refunding agreement between the United States and Great Britain. The ambassador had an engagement with the American debt refunding commission to sign these papers on Tuesday, but on that day trouble with his left eye developed and he was compelled to summon Dr. Wilmer. The examination disclosed local trophic with one eye, the exact nature of which the embassy declined to disclose. The ambassador's condition gave rise today to the publication of reports that he was nearly blind and in "danger of total blindness."

At the British embassy tonight it was stated that there is no real foundation for these reports. "The published reports are grossly exaggerated," said Mr. Tennant, the ambassador's private secretary. "There is nothing in the diagnosis to indicate any danger of blindness. The ambassador has serious trouble with one eye and has been ordered to take a complete rest for several weeks. He is able to sign any important documents requiring his signature."

**MITCHELL AND LEONARD TO FIGHT IN CHICAGO**

CHICAGO, May 30.—Pinkey Mitchell 22years old product of the amateur ranks, and brother of Ritchie Mitchell, will meet Benny Leonard, world's lightweight champion, in a ten round match here tomorrow night, with indications that the gate receipts will reach the \$60,000 to \$100,000 mark.

The contest will probably be the last seen in Chicago for some time, as it will be staged to test the Illinois anti-prize fight law. As the result of an agreement reached between J. G. Mullen, the promoter, and city officials, the bouts would be fought with out interference, but Promoter Mullen will be arrested afterward.

BELLEVILLE, ILLS., May 30.—Lieutenants John A. McCreedy and Oakley G. Kelley, flying in the giant monoplane, the T. 2, in which they recently made their trans-continental non-stop flight, arrived at Scott's Field, near here at 1.40 p. m. from Kansas City, making the 270 miles in three hours and fifteen minutes.


