GREEK ARMY READY FOR WAR

LAUSANNE, May 23.—If Turkey insists on war to settle the question of the indemnity she claims is due from Greece, then Greece will accept the case of battle, M. Alexandris, the Greek Foreign Minister, told the foreign correspondent tonight. The Greek delegates, he added, will be withdrawn from the Near Eastern Conference this week if Turkey persists on her reparations demands. The Turks have given no indication of an intention to recede from their reparations demands and M. Alexandris' declaration that Greece was resolved not to pay one cent of indemnity brought increased pessimism.

ISMET PASHA VIRTUALLY A PRISONER AS RESULT OF PLOTS AGAINST HIS LIFE

LAUSANNE, May 23.—In consequence of reports of plots against the Turkish delegation to the Near East Peace Conference, the Swiss police have requested Ismet to allow them in protecting him by discontinuing his custom of eating in the public dining room of the hotel where he is residing. Therefore, Ismet, all unwillingly, is practically a prisoner in his room. When he goes to the sessions of the conference, he is strongly guarded. The hotel lodging to Turkish, French and Japanese delegates is surrounded by an additional force of detectives, as Switzerland wants no repetition of the Vorovsky tragedy.

Official Records

Official records of sporting events, horse racing or production of dairy cattle are competitions in which competent officials or judges are keeping time, weights or measurements as the case may be of competitions under oath to assure their accuracy. When we speak of a race horse having an official record we mean that it was made by authorized time-keepers.

The official records of the production of dairy cattle are made by competent officials appointed for the purpose, who must make affidavit with all those connected in any way with the work as to the accuracy of the records of production made. We very frequently read of a large number of different animals making either provincial or Maritime records, and it is often confusing to the laymen to understand why so many different periods of production in the hold records of production in the same province. It is possible for cattle to hold individual records for different periods of one day, seven days, three hundred and five days or three hundred and sixty-five days, and as cows and heifers may each hold individual records ranging in age from two years up to maturity it will be easy to understand why so many official or semi-official records can be claimed by different owners. When a record is published said to be made under R.O.P. regulations it means that the cow has completed a record that is known to be semi or partly official. A breeder of any pure bred cow may make application to the Live Stock Department at Ottawa who will send him record sheets on which the daily weights of the cow's milk must be recorded. The owner and milker are required to make an affidavit of the accuracy of these weights. Without warning an official of the Federal Department comes to his barn, checks the weights and takes samples of the cows for two days, which he tests for butter fat, and the average of this is the test or per cent of butter fat that is credited the weights of milk the cow has given between the times of his visits. At the end of the period the total weights of milk are checked and the average per cent of fat as taken by the official tester is credited the animal and a certificate of Record of Performance or semi-official record is issued.

As different classes are made for Junior and Senior animals from two years old up to mature cows, eight different cows or heifers in a province could claim to hold the highest official record in these classes, as all made their records at different ages. The same regulations hold true in regard to the "Official Tests" made under R.O.P. or Record of Merit Rules. This is purely an official test and the only breed of dairy cattle using this method of record testing is the Holstein Friesian.

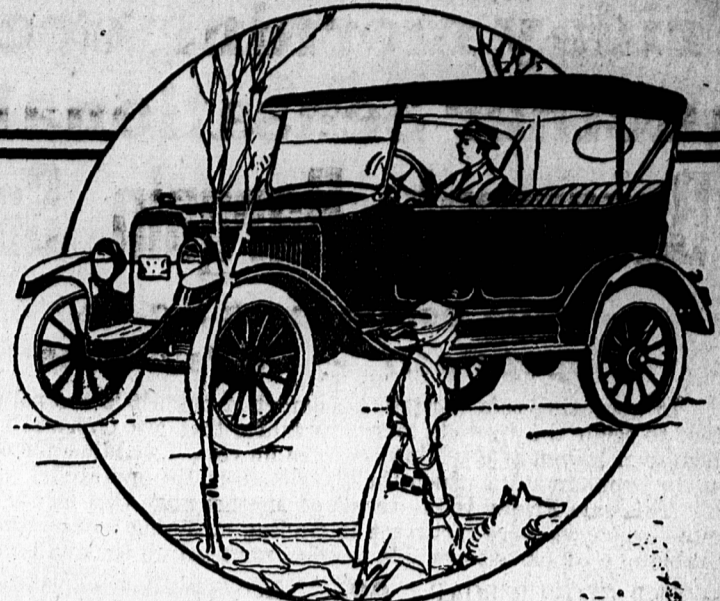

Any one wishing to make a record with a pure bred Holstein cow should apply to the Secretary of this Association, W. J. Clemons, Brantford, Ontario, who requests some resident official of the different local Departments to name a competent man in the Province, whose work they will vouch for to make the record. This man must be competent to conduct the Babcock test; he must go to the barn of the owner of the cow and see that she is milked dry at a certain period of time, he must agree to conduct the entire test according to the regulations laid down by the Holstein Friesian Association, which include—that the cow, six weeks must not be fed any drugs or medicines, and that the recusable record that can be made by a cow is held by Dekol Pius Sels Dixie, who has given 32,632 lbs. of milk in the past year.
