**IMMIGRANT'S  
 SAD MISTAKE**

Galician Threw Away \$25 In Pocket of His Old Pants

MONTREAL, March 11.—A Galician who formed one of the contingent of immigrants from South Eastern Europe arrived here from St. John in a state of raptur at the time of his arrival. He had come from the north side of the Atlantic by the Newfoundland and on getting on the J. P. R. train he got on a pile of clean trousers, as these he had worn across during the trip were torn as well as dirty. He threw them out of the window of the car upon the snow bank by the side of the line. Some time later he thought of his money, the sum of \$25, which seemed to have in some unaccountable way disappeared from his pockets. Suddenly he remembered that he had thrown it away in his discarded garment. He was utterly at loss what to do. His ticket to Montreal and he was bound for Winnipeg. He was without money, with no friends, and unable to speak English. He communicated his unfortunate plight to one of the interpreters of the immigration Department and as there was collateral evidence supporting the testimony of his loss, steps were taken to provide him with facilities for continuing his journey. He left Montreal in the afternoon in a happier frame of mind than he entered it early in the day.
