**At A Glance**

CHICAGO, June 5 — (AP) — Grain futures prices declined today with wheat leading the decline. There was a pronounced lack of support and observers were of the opinion that most of the selling was hedging.

MONTREAL, June 5 — (CP) — Firm spots dominated today's trading on the Stock Exchange and Curb Market in continuation of Monday's bullish tendencies. Papers and industrials went to new eight-year highs in the indices and number of individual shares traded was the largest for a single day in five years. Selling was mostly fractional but in spots ran up to five points.

TORONTO, June 5 — (CP) — Industrial stocks continued their advance into new high ground for the last eight years in today's session, posting an index gain of 87 while the golds added 56 and the Western Oils 29. Base Metal Stocks took an index loss of 38. Volume at 1,345,000 shares was the heaviest in more than a week. C.N.R. weakened 1-1/2, Canadian Breweries had a small loss. Closing prices were down narrowly for the Canadian Canners issues.

WINNIPEG, June 5 — (CP) — Displaying declining tendencies, rye futures were 2 7/8 to 1 cent a bushel lower at the close today on the Winnipeg Grain Exchange. Reports of large sales of grain by the Argentine yesterday were a factor in the declines. Commission house selling which met light support sent July down four and August four cents at times. October and December fell as much as two cents. Offerings dried up near the close and some recoveries were scored.

NEW YORK, June 5 — (AP) — Aircrafts led a specialized advance in today's Stock Market although leaders in virtually all other departments exhibited stumbling tendencies.

Numerous pleasing dividends aided sentiment and optimism still was a buying factor. The Associated Press 60-stock average was off 1 of a point at 66.2. Dealings were at a point at intervals but slowed after midday. Transfers totalled 1,510,000 shares compared with 1,540,000 Monday.

LONDON, June 4 — (CP) — Construction of underground automobile parking beneath new structures to be built on local blitzed sites is being advocated by the Royal Automobile Club.

**"FIRST IN—FIRST OUT"**

Timing of discharge of men from the Armed Forces is based primarily on length and type of service—to give the advantage to those in the longest.

But the early release of some men with special skill or experience will contribute to the maintenance of maximum production, and, hence, the prompt employment of other men as discharged.

Employers in industry may make application for the speedy release of any man in the Forces, where the employer can prove that:

1. the man has a special skill or experience needed in his plant or business;
2. the employment of the man will aid—effective further prosecution of the war;

reconversion of industry; prompt employment of men and women discharged from the Forces.

Any application by an employer must be made to a District Committee.

Applications approved by this Committee will be submitted to the Industrial Selection and Release Board at Ottawa.

The Board and Committees will have representatives of the Departments of Labour, National Defence, Munitions and Supply and Reconstruction, as well as of the National Employment Service.

After thorough investigation by the Committee and the Board, cases recommended upon favourably will be submitted to the Armed Forces for action—subject to the man agreeing and the Forces not requiring his services further.

The procedure applies to men regardless of where now posted—whether overseas or in Canada.
