SHIPS OWNERS ON THE CANAL BILL

LONDON, August 28—English ship-owners are of the opinion that the time has come for any concerted protest against the Panama canal bill and that individual protests are useless. They regard the matter as one for government protests, and rely on Sir Edward Grey to handle the matter to the best of their interests. The general manager of the Harrison Line said today:—

"We regret the president's step, of course, but we hardly see what we can do. The situation will probably adjust itself, but I think that any protest must be a matter for the government and not for individual shipowners."

SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH. WEST LAND REGULATIONS.

ANY person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years old, may homestead a quarter section of a suitable Dominion land in any of the Northwest Territories, Yukon, or Alaska. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or District Office. Duties—Six months residence (not by proxy) may be made at any Agency, or certain conditions by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader.

Duties—Six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within the limits of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres solely owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister.

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may preempt a quarter section of land at the homestead price of \$100 per acre.

Duties—Must reside upon the homestead or pre-emption six months in each of six years from date of homestead entry (including the time required to enter homestead patent) and cultivate five acres extra.

A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and cannot obtain pre-emption, may enter for a purchased homestead in certain areas. Price \$10 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate fifty acres and erect a house worth \$200.00.
