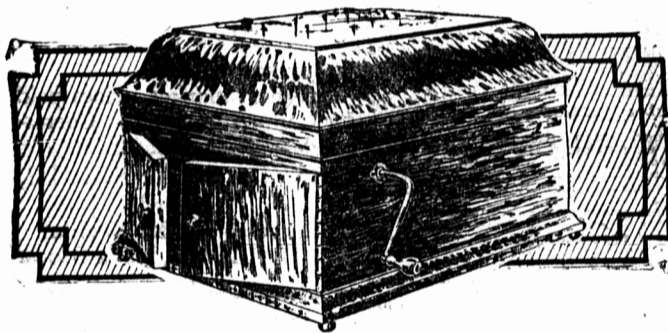

IN MEMORIAM

ARTHUR HARRIS KELLY.

MRS. JOHN MCFARLANE

Once more has death made desolate the home of Mrs. John MacFarlane, South Melville. But a short time ago it was her son, now it is herself that is called away, after having patiently endured a lengthy illness. The end came on Sunday evening, May 25th. With her family gathered around her bedside she calmly fell asleep in Jesus. The funeral on Tuesday, from her home to the cemetery at Black Point, along the Argyle Shore, where she was laid to rest beside her husband who had gone before, was very largely attended, and was an evidence of the very high esteem in which she was held by all. She was a woman of sterling Christian character, and has left a vacancy in church and community, which it will be hard to fill.

I., but who is now at home, and Mrs. Walter Rogerson, Hampton; and two sons: William at home, and John David, De Sable.

To those and to others less closely connected the many friends of the family wish to extend the heart-felt sympathy of a community which has appreciated the exemplary life of Mrs. MacFarlane, and which mourns deeply their loss.

MURDER BY MOTOR-CAR.

An appalling exhibit of motor-vehicle manslaughter is made by the official figures submitted by Secretary of State May in his statement to Governor Sulzer urging the need of more adequate automobile laws. During the years 1911 and 1912 967 persons were killed and 6,107 seriously injured in automobile accidents in the State of New York. In the borough of Manhattan alone since 1911, 585 persons have been killed outright and more than 4,000 injured by motor vehicles.

This wanton sacrifice of human life has been due in part to the carelessness of pedestrians. It has in larger part been due to reckless driving and the incompetence of chauffeurs. But behind it all and serving as a main contributing cause is the unintelligent conflicting and unenforceable legislation regulating automobile traffic. Automobile safety is not a matter of maximum or minimum speed. It is a matter of individual responsibility. There are conditions of traffic under which a speed of ten miles an hour is more dangerous than a speed of thirty miles. A car driven at ten miles an hour in the congested streets of the east side, for example, might kill a score of persons in as many blocks, where one driver at maximum speed on upper Broadway at night might

cause no risk. It is only by recognizing this varying factor of danger and embodying it in legislation that progress can be made by dealing with the scandal of automobile fatalities. When a driver's criminal responsibility for the death of a pedestrian is made to depend, not on the speed of the car, but on his exercise of caution and judgment in the circumstances, sometimes definite may be accomplished in alleviating the menace of motor-car murder. It can never be done under either state or local regulation based on arbitrary speed standards.—New York World.

HONOR BARBARA FRIETCHIE.

FREDERICK, Md., May 30.—The body of Barbara Frietchie, heroine of Whittier's poem, and that of her husband, John C. Frietchie, which were recently disinterred from the old Reformed Congregation Cemetery here, were formally deposited in the new mausoleum in Mt. Olivet Cemetery today.

Barbara Frietchie was born in Lancaster, Pa., December 3, 1766. Her maiden name was Barbara Haner. When on September 6, 1862, Frederick was invaded by the Confederate army there was but one "Star-Spangled Banner" to be seen flying in the breeze. This was displayed in the little former window of a quaint old house in West Patrick street, the home of the Frietchies. The entire body of the Confederate army marched directly past the house on Friday, September 12, and on the next morning the eyes of the old lady were gladdened by the sight of the Federals, who, taking the same route as the Confederates, followed along on their footsteps. Mrs. Frietchie did not long survive the episode which inspired Whittier to write his famous poem. She died less than three months later, on December 10, 1862, at the age of 96 years.

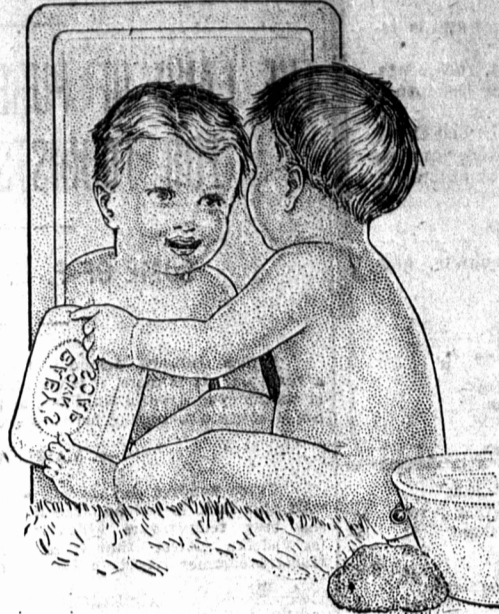
