SUFFRAGETTES IN BIG DEMONSTRATION. WASHINGTON, D. C., July 31—The second big demonstration that the advocates of women suffrage have held in the national capital this year took place today and was carried out far more successfully than the similar demonstration and parade held last March on the eve of the inauguration of President Wilson.

The demonstration was participated in by delegations of suffragettes from many States. The delegations rendezvoused during the forenoon at Fayetteville, Md., where they were officially greeted by the Washington suffragists and escorted into the city in automobiles. At Hyattsville there was a program of speaking in the public park and the raising of a suffrage flag.

Upon arrival in the capital the parade of automobiles proceeded south on 14th Street to Pennsylvania Avenue, and then on to the Capitol. The presentation of the petitions to the Senate was accompanied by brief addresses delivered by several of the national leaders of the equal suffrage movement.

Trinidad Electric, 5 p. c. 92 89 GREAT CONGRESS OF GEOLOGISTS.

TORONTO, Ont., July 31—One week from today the twelfth International Geological Congress will begin its sessions in this city. The congress will be the largest and most important gathering of scientists ever held in Canada.

The attendance will be made up of nearly one thousand delegates from about thirty countries. The largest contingents will come from the United States, Great Britain and Germany, in the order named. All the countries of Europe will be represented. In addition there will be delegates from Mexico and several South American countries and from Japan, China, India, Manchuria, South Africa, Australia, New Zealand and the Philippines.

The International Geological Congress is essentially a working body of scientists. The members consist principally of professors and teachers from the leading colleges and universities of the world, officers of government geological surveys and geologists and mining engineers in private practice.

DEVOTION OF PORTIUNCULA.

Beginning this afternoon and continuing until sunset tomorrow, Catholics throughout the world will take part in the devotion of Portiuncula. The indulgence of Portiuncula may be gained at any of the churches of the three great orders instituted by St. Francis. In every Franciscan church there will be a constant procession of worshippers bent on securing the proffered grace. The indulgence is not confined to members of a Franciscan parish, but every Catholic who carries out the necessary requirements may gain it. Portiuncula affords one of the very rare occasions when more than one plenary indulgence may be gained in a day, as this indulgence is merited for each visit during which the proper prayer is offered. The devotee must leave the church, however, after each indulgence, and, on returning, recite a short prayer. Only the first indulgence is applicable to the visitor, and the remainder must be applied to the souls in purgatory. The conditions for gaining the indulgence are confession and communion. In addition, the heads of the church recommend public prayers, such as the recitation of the rosary for the sovereign pontiff, the bishops, clergy and the church, with an invocation to St. Francis of Assisi, Portiuncula is the name of a small church near Assisi, Italy, which became famous throughout the Catholic world because of the remarkable indulgence St. Francis gained for the chapel. The indulgence was granted in 1223, and ever since the small church has been visited each first of August by thousands of pilgrims. As the chapel holds only a few people, the devotees walk through in endless procession, praying and singing, while a small army of priests administers the sacrament of penance. In 1522 the indulgence was extended to all Franciscan churches and it is now generally observed throughout the Catholic world.

PEACEFUL OUTLOOK. LONDON, July 31—The conclusion of a peace treaty among the Balkan states is regarded as assured by the news of a five days armistice agreed on yesterday. Still anyone of them is liable to break it when its own interests demand.
