NEW YORK, Dec. 8.—(AP)—The stock market today maintained its December bullish tempo with another broad array of gains in industrial and rail leaders.

MONTREAL, Dec. 8.—(CP)—Faced by papers and interrelated securities all groups in the averages showed higher ratings after trading today on the Stock Exchange and Curb Market.

WINNIPEG, Dec. 8.—(CP)—Substantial buying for American accounts pushed the market higher ground today on the Winnipeg grain Exchange and futures closed 1-4 to 3-8 higher.

CHICAGO, Dec. 8.—(AP)—Grains slumped today although at one time rye prices were up about a cent, reaching new seasonal peaks.

LONDON, Dec. 8.—(AP)—A self-active demand for industrials kept the Stock Market on an even keel today. Other groups were quiet.

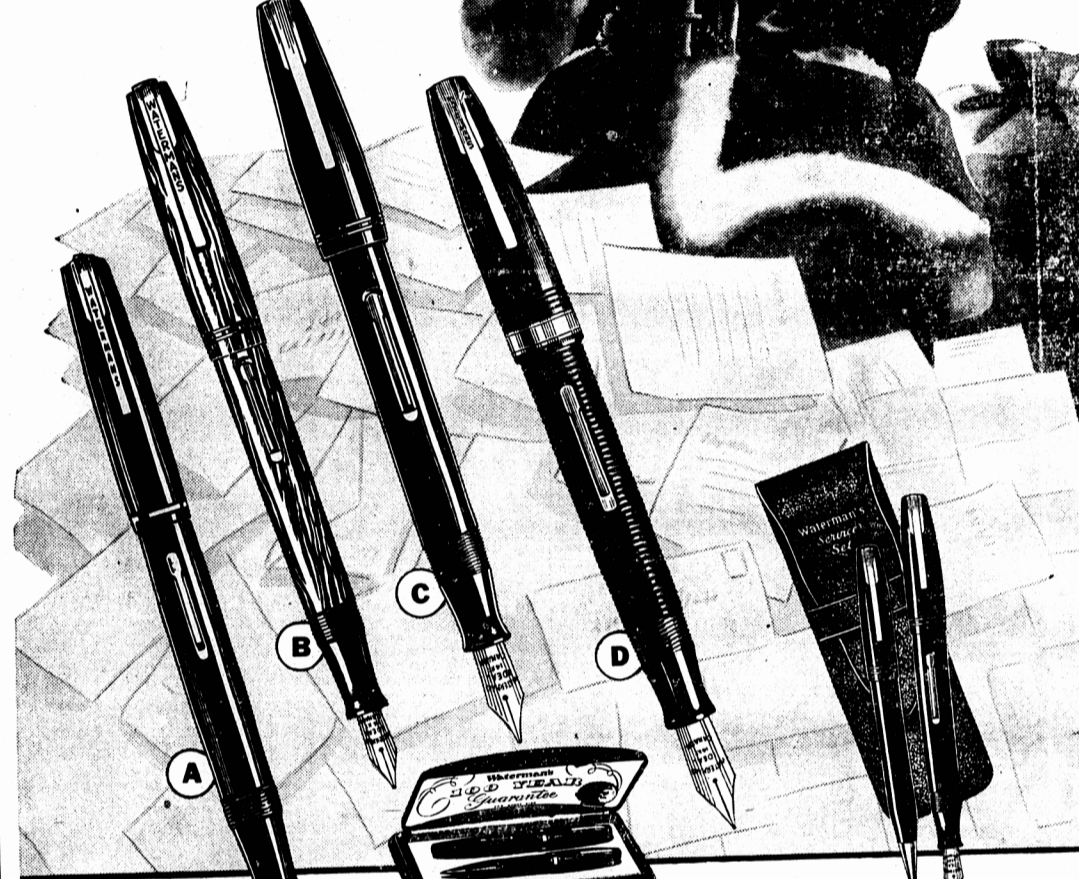

Briefs From Britain

BIRMINGHAM, England.—(CP)—Rev. W. G. Sharp, rector here for 19 years, was presented with the equivalent of \$450 when he retired.

LONDON.—(CP)—Eight members of a Winchmore Hill Housewives' Guild run their own munition factory in a room of a private house.

SANDRINGHAM, England.—(CP)—A pair of racing pigeons from the King's loft at Sandringham will be sold at a Red Cross auction at Newmarket.

DARTFORD, England.—(CP)—At a Dartmouth charity auction a two-pound pot of jam brought \$50.

LONDON.—(CP)—Between the end of June and the end of October more than 4,000 refugees arrived in Britain, many without visas.

CANTERBURY, England.—(CP)—A scale model of the proposed new centre of Canterbury is nearing completion.

MALDON, England.—(CP)—The council of this Essex town has increased the mayor's salary from \$20 to \$450 a year.

LONDON.—(CP)—Nature reserves are to be established in Britain after the war by the Ministry of Town and Country Planning to protect rare species of birds, animals, and plants.

BELFAST.—(CP)—Rev. D. McKeen, Moderator of the Irish Presbyterian Church, died here.

BIRMINGHAM England.—(CP)

Industrial Safety Conference here today, 90 per cent of employees are injured annually.

LONDON.—(CP)—Soldiers detailed to kitchen police would protest if they were to be sent to a Middle East cookery. Made from scrap, the machine would a sack of potatoes in 10 minutes.
