THE GUARDIAN'S WEEK END. SERMON A GRAND KIDNEY MEDICINE

Sermon preached by Rev. J. W. Aikens. They fought Daniel and cast him into the den of lions. Daniel 6-16.

The whole trouble arose because Daniel was first in the Kingdom. Had he been last, there would have been no jealousy and hence no plot. Why was Daniel first? Because he was a righteous man? If righteousness exalteth a nation, it follows that it will also afflict an individual. The world will forgive a public man many things but they will not forgive unrighteousness and immorality. Nothing can take the place of goodness and nothing should be esteemed so highly. But he was also a man of ability. His bitterest enemies were forced to admit that he had a good record behind him.

One would naturally conclude that at least they might have left him alone but the devil never leaves a good man alone. If the bad man cannot answer your arguments he can try to kill you, so they came with their plot to place in the den a good record behind him. That which cripples many a man who seeks promotion, is the fact that his record is not clean. When a certain man in an American city started in to unearth some of the sins of the men at the head of affairs, his enemies sent back to his old home to find if there was anything against his record. Daniel had been tried, tested and proven and that was why he was first.

The old King was weak at one point and there he was trapped. Being a man man he had no objection to being "God for a month" but like many another his weakness caused his friends much trouble. It is a comfort, thing to remember that our weak points may become our strength. Years ago there were weak places in the dykes of Holland but the inhabitants began to plant trees about the weak spots and otherwise strengthen them, until now these same places are able to resist all the power of the sea.

The situation that confronts Daniel is the same as that of God or go into the den of lions. There is nothing ancient about that. Every Christian has to face a lion's den in some form. A man was asked to sign a petition for a license to sell intoxicating liquor. He was a comparatively poor man and much of the goods he manufactured were used in hotels, in houses, like financial ruin to him, but he faced his lion's den and refused to sign. A young clerk is compelled sometimes to be a party to a dishonest business transaction or lose his job. A young lady must either engage in questionable amusements or receive the cold shoulder from society. So the details differ but the principle is the same in all generations. Personally I am not anxious to give anybody from the lion's den. God allowed Daniel to enter it, because it was best that he should for every one that hath forsaken houses, or brethren or sisters or father or mother or wife or children or lands for my name's sake shall receive an hundred fold and shall inherit everlasting life. Principle's thing that must be acted upon or we will lose it. It pays financially, socially, and spiritually to go into the lion's den with God.

Now when Daniel knew that the decree was signed, he took a month's holiday. That is how some people get around an awkward situation. When a vote is to be taken on some moral question, some public men manage to be called away until the storm blows over. Such a man is a poltroon and a coward. Surely I don't want to see a man close his window and plug up the key hole when he prays to his God.

The men who do business behind closed doors and closed doors are not of the Daniel type. Perhaps he will open his window higher and pray louder. We are not called upon to invite danger. Jesus did not walk in Jewry when he knew that the Jews desired to kill him. The Bible states that Daniel "kneeled upon his knees three times a day and prayed and gave thanks before his God as he did aforetime." Blessed is the man who does not need to change the program of his life when he is suddenly confronted with death! Did Daniel expect that God would deliver him. Even Darius expected that, for he said "thy God whom thou servest continually, he will deliver thee." What an impression Daniel's life must have made on the people before whom he walked. Daniel "believed in his God" and through his faith "stopped the mouths of lions."

We have now two pictures, the triumph of the wicked, the repentance of the King, the victory of Daniel. There is a triumph of wickedness. The princes and counselors met together and congratulated each other. "We have settled Daniel and his principles too," said one. "The old King was an easy mark," said another. "It was a good plot and no one suspects us, let us have a drink all round," said a third. But God adds another word viz "the triumph of the wicked is short," the joy of the hypocrite is but for a moment. The King passed the night fasting, he had labored hard to undo his mistake but failed. So there will come a day when sinners will knock at a closed door vainly striving to undo their fatal choice. How did Daniel

pass the night? In high fellowship with God, in great peace of mind and in perfect safety. Some people think this story is too wonderful to be true, but there is nothing here that is not happening every day. The wicked are still plotting against the good. The plot succeeds for a time, but still serve God at any cost and God still delivers his people. There are two ways of looking at this miracle. One man approaches it from an earthly standpoint and having nothing but earthly experiences, he finds difficulties, impossibilities, absurdities and to him it is a foolish story. Another man approaches it from the standpoint of heaven and with a heavenly experience; he has had a deliverance himself from a devil who goes about as a roaring lion and to him the story presents no difficulties. In fact it would be a wonderful thing to him if God had not shut the lions' mouths.

Daniel comes out of the den of lions a better and a stronger man but his presence makes it very awkward for his enemies. Their laughter is turned into dismay and their rejoicing was short-lived. That a notable miracle has been wrought cannot be denied, but at least they can attempt to explain it away. One prince suggested that Daniel was stolen away during the night, but the King's seal was unbroken and that theory failed. When things began to look dark one of the presidents declared that he had always believed in Daniel and was glad to see him alive. He hung his head however when some one said, "If you are Daniel's friend why do you not associate with his enemies?" The man who tries to be on both sides is always despised. Finally a man with a very learned appearance stepped to the front and declared that he could explain the miracle. "There is not the least doubt of King that the lions were overfed before Daniel was placed in the den and hence not being hungry they did not harm him." He was the destructive critic of Daniel's day, but the king was in a practical mood that morning and said—"If you think the lions are overfed you shall go down into the den and see" and "the lions had the mastery of them and break all their bones in pieces or they came at the bottom of the den." It is all very well to have theories but will the theories stand the test?

How futile are the best efforts of the wicked! They dig a pit for the righteous and fall into it themselves. Their sword enters their own heart, they are like chaff which the wind driveth away. The triumph of right is assured, but the battle for right is not fought in the air. Right must be embodied in people who will stand up for it and risk all for it. May the "excellent spirit" that was in Daniel be also in us.

Synopsis of Canadian North west Land Regulations. ANY person who is the sole head of a family or any male over 18 years old, may be stoned a quarter-section of available homestead land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or its Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made by attorney, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader. Duties—Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 20 acres (solely owned) and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister. In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section of his homestead. Price \$20 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of six years from date of homestead entry (including the time required to earn homestead patent) and cultivate fifty acres extra. A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and cannot obtain a pre-emption, may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$20 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of six years, cultivate fifty acres and erect house worth \$2000.00.
