Endeavour I Anchors Are Scores Win Eliminated By Over Ranger Bowery Bees

NEWPORT, R. I., July 29—Ranger, the sloop with which Harold S. Vanderbilt will essay his third consecutive defence of the America's Cup starting this Saturday, today suffered her first defeat after 13 straight victories.

She finished third to T. O. M. Sogwith's first British challenger Endeavour I, which Vanderbilt, sailing Rainbow, vanquished in 1934.

Gerard O. Lambert's Yankee, three runner-up in the pursuit of defence honors, came in second, a minute and 46 seconds astern of the old challenger. Ranger trailed Yankee by a minute and 37 seconds.

Rainbow, now owned and skippered by Chandler Hovey, finished the 37-mile run from Vineyard Haven, Mass., nearly 11 minutes behind the boat she sent back to England empty-handed in 1934.

Ranger was dealt defeat by American hands, for the English sloop was skippered by Sherman Hoyt, a member of Vanderbilt's afterguard both in 1934 and in 1930, the year his last Enterprise victory over Shamrock V, last of the late Sir Thomas Lipton's line of green challengers.

Hoyt, who was at Endeavour I's wheel 5 1/2 hours before he accepted a relief, said "I could not have missed it for anything."

Hoyt will skipper Endeavour I tomorrow again in a race off here, the final sailed in connection with the current cruise of the Eastern Yacht Club.
