**ADDRESS TO REV. A. McLEAN SINCLAIR**

The Well Known Pastor of the Presbyterian Church at Belfast

In view of the resignation of the Rev. A. McLean Sinclair for so many years, the well known pastor of the Presbyterian Church at Belfast, a number of his friends and members of the congregation, waited on him on the evening of August 30th and presented him with the following address:

Rev. A. McLean Sinclair, Belfast.

Rev. and Dear Sir, Oh this the occasion of your voluntary resignation of the pastoral charge of the historic congregation of Belfast, after an incumbency of eighteen years, we cannot refrain from expressing our high regard for you, and our deep regret at your resolution to leave us.

You have by your intellectual gifts as they have been revealed from time to time in your learned and well known books, and in your contributions to the press, raised our church with yourself into a prominence which Belfast Church could never have attained but for you.

You have by your indomitable energy succeeded in turning the place where our dead sleep, from a veritable wilderness into that which after a little attention could be made into a garden rendering the spot one of the fairest on our beautiful island. You have by your marvellous industry succeeded in restoring and beautifying and placing on a fine condition the church in which our fathers worshipped and in which we ourselves have enjoyed our ministrations.

You have in addition inspired by your historic genius, secured for us that pleasing memorial of the forefathers of many of us, which stands fittingly on an eminence looking towards the land of "Brown Heath and Shaggy Wood" the land from which they came.

These things have shown your worth. But greater by far have been the incalculable benefits received by us from your unfolding of the Word of Life.

Your unflinching zeal in attendance on the aged, the sick and the congregation in general, and the manner in which you entered into our joys and sorrows and your heart felt sympathy with us when such things occurred in our lives, makes us feel that we are losing a genuine friend a wise helper and a true pastor.

To these feeble expressions of our appreciation of your labors and worth, we would also add our expression of the sense of the loss we sustain in Mrs. Sinclair's removal. She has been all we

**SEVERE BLOW AT CUBAN PROSPERITY**

NEW YORK, Sept. 6.—A Havana special to the Herald says that a movement—peaceful but ominous—is being in Cuba which may soon render the fruits of victory of little value to the government force in the field. Laborers are leaving the country. Without them the industries of the island must perish. One of the chief efforts of the Cuban congress was to attack immigration the expenses of families wishing to settle here being paid by the public treasury, which was specially active in inducing workmen to come from Spain because the best harvest is the enormous sugar crop. They were sorely needed to replace those who returned to Spain on the loss of the island to the crown. Fully a thousand it is said, of these immigrants are preparing to go back home. Without this labor the sugar planters can do little. They are blue and it is no exaggeration to say that men versed in finance are beginning to fear a panic. No one will lend money even on the best security. This puts the planters in a very bad way.

**SUNDAY SCHOOL LESSON**

THIRD QUARTER.  
WORDS AND WORKS OF JESUS AS RECORDED IN THE GOSPELS.  
LESSON XII.—SEPTEMBER 16.  
JESUS SILENCES THE PHARISEES AND SADDUCEES.  
Mark 12: 13-27. Mem. vs. 27.  
GOLDEN TEXT.  
Render to Caesar the things that are Caesar's, and to God the things that are God's.—Mark 12: 17.

Place.—In the courts of the temple at Jerusalem.

EXPLANATION.

13. "They send"—The rulers, members of the Sanhedrin at Jerusalem. "The Herodians" Jewish royalists, partisans of Herod, a political rather than a religious party holding Sadducean opinions. They believe that the hopes of the Jewish nation rested on the Herods, to whom they looked for the fulfillment of prophecies regarding the future prosperity of the nation.

14. "Master, we know that thou art true, and carest for no man"—These words, while true, were in the mouths of those speaking them gross hypocrisy. The spirit of which the Master did not fail to comprehend. "Is it lawful to give tribute?"—The tribute referred to was a tax levied by the Roman government and keenly resented by every patriotic Jew. If Jesus, therefore, sanctioned its payment he would increase the hatred of the national party toward him; if, on the contrary, he held that the payment of this tribute was unlawful they would have cause for bringing him before the Roman authorities.

15. "Why tempt ye me?"—Jesus will have them know before he answers their questions that he fully understands their purpose. "Penny"—A Roman coin used in the payment of the tax referred to.

17. "Render"—Literally, "give back; pay as being due." It was not a question of voluntary gift, but of a legal duty. The coin with Caesar's image was evidence of Roman authority as actually existing. To Caesar, therefore, they are to give what he can lawfully demand; but Jesus reminds the inquirers that God also has a claim upon them, and that obedience to Caesar must ever be conditioned by obedience to God. "They marvelled at him"—Neither the orthodox Pharisee nor the aristocratic royalist could take exception to the answer given.

18. The Pharisees having failed in their attempt, their rivals, the Sadducees, now came forward with a question. We note that each party presents a question of special interest to themselves. The Sadducees, who believed not in the resurrection, seek to catch him with an apparent inconsistency in Scripture teaching concerning the resurrection of the dead.

19. "Moses wrote"—For the law referred to compare Deut. 25, 5. The purpose of the law was the preservation of families, but it was not strictly observed by the Jews, who were adverse to fulfilling its enactment. (Comp. also Gen. 38, 8.)

21. "(Now) there were seven brethren"—A hypothetical case for purposes of argument.

22. "In the resurrection (therefore)"—Their no loss of the resurrection life were entirely carnal. They took for granted that all the relations of this life would be continued in the next.

23. "Do ye not therefore err because ye know not the scriptures, neither the power of God?"—Jesus traces their error to twofold ignorance, which he proceeds in the next verses to point out.
