VANCOUVER, Jan. 2 (CP)—Charles M. Stewart, chairman of the Joint Advisory Board of Street Railway Workers' Union locals in Vancouver, Victoria and New Westminster, announced today the union would begin a strike Jan. 9 in protest against an adverse decision from the National War Labor Board on the workers' demand for wage increases and improved working conditions.

There are some 2,000 street car and bus operators in the Street Railway Workers' Union in the three cities.

Callbeck, Hancock Top Winners In First Day's Judging At Pelt Show

Foxmen's Banquet Feature of Program Yesterday; Standard Silvers To Be Judged Today.

Yesterday morning at the Summerside High School auditorium began the difficult task of judging the large number of entries in the Seventh Annual Prince Edward Island Pelt Show. The largest number of pelts have been entered in the show, in all 64 skins, were catalogued and Douglas Bell of Charlottetown began the onerous task of distributing the honors of the large entry to the many exhibitors. During the morning session judging of the White Marked Silvers took place and was concluded by noon with the honors very evenly distributed among the exhibitors. The judging of the Platinum Silvers was concluded during the afternoon session.

The banquet tendered to foxmen and exhibitors at the Olympia restaurant, was largely attended. Lt.-Col. D. A. MacKinnon, Charlottetown, acted as chairman and proposed the toast to the King. In his opening remarks Colonel MacKinnon welcomed the exhibitors and paid tribute to the efforts they are making to improve the quality of the foxes raised in this Province. He reviewed briefly the progress which has been made in producing better pelts and complimented the exhibitors who have handled the pelts of the directorate who worked so hard to make the show a success. He believed that the collection of pelts on display would do justice to the reputation of P. E. Island foxmen and maintain the proud name the Province has always had for raising foxes.

Douglas Bell, the judge of the show, commented briefly on the quality of the pelts on display. He congratulated the fur organizations in Summerside on the excellent collection of pelts on display and believed that if these organizations did not take up this year's show, the percentage of foxes would be 25 per cent lower than they are.

Various ranchers, including George A. Callbeck, F. G. Clark, and W. H. MacKinnon, spoke briefly on matters of interest to ranchers in general.
