NEW YORK ELECTION TODAY.

In New York, the second city of the world in population, three men are struggling for the mayoralty today. These are George B. McClellan, who has held the office during the past term; William M. Ivins, the Republican candidate, and William Randolph Hearst, who heads the Municipal Ownership ticket. Mr. McClellan although elected by Tammany, has made a fairly good mayor, and the great city has usually a very large Democratic majority. Mr. Ivins is a wealthy and broadminded citizen who would make a good Mayor, if he could be elected, but his party is in a hopeless minority in the city. Mr. Hearst is a rather disreputable millionaire, who owns half a dozen or more widely circulated yellow journals in as many American cities, but has associated with him in support of municipal ownerships a number of strong and reputable men.

The real fight for the Mayoralty appears to be between McClellan and Hearst. The municipal ownership plank seems to be popular in New York and Hearst has succeeded in rallying to his standard the Socialist, Anarchist and foreign element to a dangerous extent. While there is danger of Hearst's election that danger may bring a measure of Republican support to McClellan, as undoubtedly the better of the two men who have really a chance of election, which the straight Republican, Ivins, apparently has not. We conclude that it will be McClellan or Hearst, wish the chances rather in favor of the former. Still there are some Republicans who hope to see Ivins elected, believing his chances to be better in a three-handed contest than in an ordinary straight party fight. Mr. Jerome for District Attorney has put up a very spirited fight, is personally very popular with all the better elements and we hope may be a winner. The contest for this office attracts only less interest than that for the Mayoralty.

The gold production of the Klondyke region for this season is reported to be \$7,086,000, on which the Dominion Government gets a royalty of 2 1/2 per cent, or over \$175,000. The production equals \$1500 per head of the men now engaged in gold mining, but both the number of miners and the amount of gold have fallen off largely in recent years.

Two cities in southwestern Russia are the scenes of acute troubles these days. One of these is Odessa, a great port on the Black Sea, with over 400,000 inhabitants. The other is Kisheneff with 108,000 situated 100 miles inland from Odessa. Kisheneff has been the scene of successive massacres of Jews. The breakdown of the national Government has brought on a repetition of these Anti Jewish outbreaks. The Russian Empire contains half the total Jewish population of the world and their condition which has long been pitiable is now extremely deplorable.

The Patriot is informed that through the good offices of Mr. Hughes M. P. a wireless telegraph station will be established at Cape Bear for the benefit of the winter steamer service. Cape Bear has telephone connection with this city, and as the winter steamers may be able to communicate with the new station when they cannot hold conference with each other the advantages will be apparent. Already the material for the Island's first wireless station is being assembled at Pictou and it will be installed in time for use during the coming winter. Minister Prefontaine is keeping things moving.

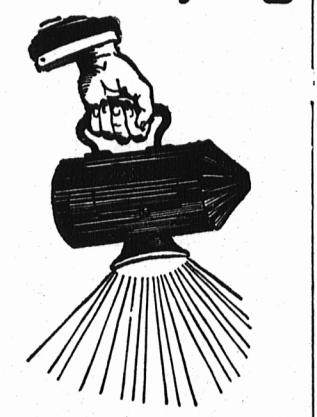

### PENSIONS TO BE ABOLISHED.

The Halifax Chronicle rejoices over the receipt of a despatch from its Ottawa correspondent to the effect that a bill will be introduced during the coming session of Parliament to repeal the pensions to ex-Ministers. The Chronicle while it speaks for the Liberal Government, and is regarded as its principal organ in Halifax, from the first opposed the pension scheme, and says it has since found no reason to change that opinion.

There can be no doubt that, as the Chronicle says, the pension scheme has been received with general disapproval and ought to be abrogated. But the general disapproval does not stop with the pensions. It is even stronger against the salary grab by Members of Parliament and the salary of \$7,000 voted to the Leader of the Opposition. Merely repealing the pension clause will not satisfy the country. A measure that fails to deal with the indemnity of members and reduce it to reasonable proportions will be merely making a scape goat of the ex-Ministers for the sins of the grabbers in the two Houses of Parliament.
