**In Memoriam**

MR. JAMES E. DARBY

In the passing away of Mr. James E. Darby on May 25th, the community of White Sands lost one of its most worthy and most highly esteemed residents. The deceased had reached the good ripe old age of 85 years and was hale and hearty up until a few days before the coming of the end.

Besides a sorrowing widow, the deceased leaves to mourn the loss of a kind and loving father, two sons and two daughters. The sons are Rev. James Darby, Westport, N.S., and William Darby, White Sands; and the daughters are Mrs. George Murdoch, Pictou, N.S., and Mrs. Neil McKay, Murray Harbor.

In addition to the two sons and two daughters living, there were also two other sons and two other daughters who passed away at different times quite a number of years ago. The two other sons were Moses Darby who was drowned some 25 years ago, and Joseph Darby, who died when quite young; and the two other daughters were Mrs. Henry Senecaugh and Mrs. Herbert Brehaut, both of Murray Harbor.

Mr. James E. Darby was a man who took a deep interest in all that pertained to the welfare of the school, the church, and the community, and he was held in high esteem by all.

He stood ready to help out in

every good cause and no one needing help ever called upon him in vain.

The coming of the end had no fears for him. He knew that the Master whom he had sought to serve faithfully throughout life would not forsake him in the swellings of Jordan. His passing was one of deep peace.

The funeral which was a very large one was held on May 29th. The service was conducted by Rev. R. Hensley Stavert and was a very impressive one throughout.

The pall-bearers were Messrs. James McKay, Kimball McKay, Sellar McKay, James Darby, Whitney Brehaut and James Slocum.

Interment was in the Murray Harbor cemetery.

**BUTTERSCOTCH FILING**

- 6 tablespoons brown sugar
  - 2 tablespoons butter
  - 3 tablespoons flour
  - 1-4 teaspoon salt
  - 1 egg
  - 1 cup milk
  - 1-4 teaspoon vanilla
- Method: Measure the sugar well, mashed down and put into a heavy skillet with the butter. Cook gently until it forms a rich, brown syrup, then add half the milk and cook until it is smooth.
- Turn into a double boiler and add the salt and the flour dissolved in the remaining milk. Cook, stirring constantly until the filing is smooth and thick. Add the well-beaten eggs and cook 2 minutes longer. Cool, add the vanilla and spread between the layers of the cold sponge cake.

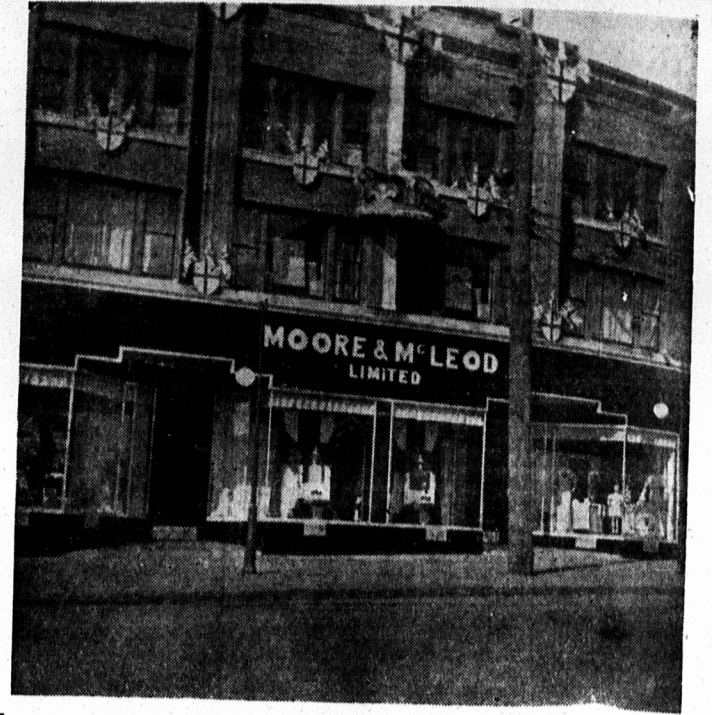

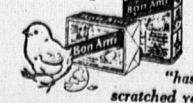
