THE GUARDIAN LOCAL NEWS

MONTAGUE SCHOOLS reopen this morning.

JOHN MCKENNA left yesterday on a visit to Montreal.

The city has stopped buying stone for concrete work in the city.

MISS ETTA CALBECK, Tryon, leaves this morning for Boston.

D. J. RILEY left yesterday for Montreal to attend the Municipal Convention.

JUDGE ROBERTSON, Mrs. Robertson and Miss Robertson, Roanoke, Virginia are spending a few days at the Acadia. Miss Robertson will spend sometime with Miss Longworth, Hillhurst.

G. B. LOCKHART, Manager of the Condensed Milk factory of this city, has been appointed general manager of the Utah Inter-Condensed Milk Company of Salt Lake City, and will leave for that place on the 15th inst. His successor has not yet been appointed.

THE S. S. City of London carried a large load of freight to Crapaud on Saturday morning and returned in the afternoon with fifteen passengers and the following cargo—40 cases eggs, 12 hogs, 5 packages butter, 5 barrels and 25 boxes produce, also a lot of household effects, iron, rope, and so forth.

COMMISSIONER COOMBS, commander of the Salvation Army in Canada, accompanied by Mrs. Coombs will make a tour of the Maritime Provinces in October. Word to this effect has just been received at the local headquarters. The exact dates of the commissioner's visit have not been made public as yet, however. It is probable, of course, that he will remain in St. John for a couple of days, and that one or more public meetings will be held.

His itinerary, like the dates of his tour, has not yet been announced. It is expected that Colonel Kyle, the new chief secretary for the Army in Canada; Lieutenant Colonel Pugnaire and Brigadier Smeeton will accompany Commissioner and Mrs. Coombs. Brigadier Smeeton has just returned from a tour of the Klondyke, and is now in Newfoundland. Mrs. Coombs did not accompany her husband on his last visit to St. John, and will doubtless receive an especially hearty welcome when she comes with him in October. Lieut. Col. J. D. Sharp returned this morning from Nova Scotia. In New Glasgow Monday he officiated at the marriage of two members of the Army. He also held an officers' council there, and one in Moncton as well. At these councils arrangements for Commissioner Coombs's visits and for the annual harvest festivals were discussed. The festivals will be held in September.—St. John Globe.

THE wedding was celebrated last evening at St. Paul's church, by the Rev. Christopher Reed, of Mr. Reginald P. Wilson and Miss Millicent Palmer, both of Dawson. The wedding was private, but a number of friends were there with rice and old shoes. The bride was given away by her brother, A. B. Palmer. The bride, Miss Millicent Palmer, is the daughter of the late Douglas Palmer, Esq. of Victoria, P. E. I. an old Prince Edward Island family of English stock. She is a sister of the well-known Palmer Brothers, for many years in business in a large way in the Klondyke. She joined her brothers in Dawson about a year ago, and in her brief residence here has reaped many firm friendships and a wide popularity. Like so many Canadians, she is an excellent skater, and a familiar figure on the rink all winter. The bride was dressed handsomely in a dress of grey tulle, with a picture hat of the same. There were no bridesmaids, the wedding party being confined to members of the family. The groom, Reginald P. Wilson, civil engineer and draughtsman, has been seven years in the Klondyke. A son of Nicholas C. Wilson of Chester, England, he was born in Liverpool thirty-five years ago. Graduating as a B. Sc. and civil engineer, he commenced an extensive travel which eventually brought him to Dawson—to meet his bride. He was four years with exploration survey parties in Ashantee, West Africa, three years in France and Belgium, and seven years here. He had a mining experience of two years in Atlin, with the White Pass as an engineer in 1898, and has been four years in the government survey office in Dawson. Mr. and Mrs. Wilson left on the steamer immediately after the ceremony for Winnipeg, Manitoba, where Mr. Wilson goes to join the firm of Chataway and Jephson, engineers and architects.—Dawson City Daily News Aug. 16th.

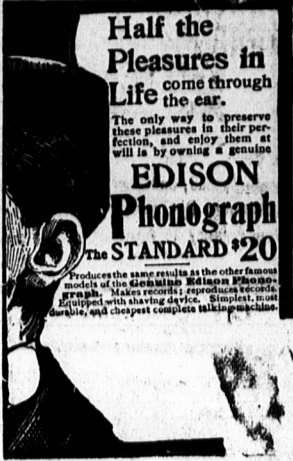
