**SOME RECOLLECTIONS.**—Mr. Neil McKenzie of Long Creek was in the city yesterday having driven in a wagon, on fairly good roads. In talking over previous visits to this city for the Christmas market Mr. McKenzie recalled that in December of 1875 he drove a right down the West River ice for the Christmas market and again in 1890 from McEwen's wharf. These are the only instances he can remember when the ice was fit for travelling on before Christmas, but he has often been ready for New Year's market. The winter of 1899-70 was also exceptionally mild and on New Year's eve two or three people, one a woman, were drowned in an open boat while rowing across the North River returning from the city. A squall came up suddenly causing the accident, which will be readily recalled by some of the older residents of the North River. On the same day an open boat came down the River from Long Creek as the ice, which a few days previously was strong enough for foot passengers, had all gone out the harbor. The weather was exceptionally mild from then on. In January 1889 Mr. McKenzie drove with a horse and wagon across West River and also in March of the same year, wheels being used all winter. The same year the old St. Southport made a trip up West River the last day of March showing the exceptional mildness of the season.
