PANAMA RUSH MAY BE AVOIDED

LONDON, Nov. 15, (Special)—"The Panama Canal is so near completion," said Colonel William C. Gorgas, "that shipping can be accommodated within two months from the present day, and some vessels probably will be availing themselves of the canal about the first of the coming year."

"When I left the isthmus on October 13, Colonel Goethals expected to have practically all the 15,000,000 cubic yards of slide eliminated from the Cucurache slide by February 1 at the latest, and there is then no reason why vessels could not pass through, provided, of course, it was at the ship owner's risk and under the vessel's own steam."

"By the time of the official opening in January, 1915, no vast amount of shipping will go through under its own stage, as there might be danger to the locks from collision, but applications will be granted to vessels in advance of the expected rush of traffic."

Colonel Gorgas, who is the chief sanitary officer in the canal zone, has been granted a leave of absence to go to the Rand. He has been asked by the officers of the Consolidated Mines at Johannesburg to install a system of sanitation there that will prove as effective as the system perfected at Panama. He is passing through London on his way to South Africa, and expects to be back in Panama late in February.

ARREST EXCITERS EAST INDIANS

LONDON, Nov. 15, (Special)—The whole Indian community throughout South Africa is excited over the arrest and sentence of Ghandi, and are observing the day as one of mourning and humiliation. All the Indian stores are closed. At Kallenback the Germans and Poles showed their sympathy with the Indians by passive resistance. At Charlottown, Natal, one sympathizer was arrested, and bail was refused, Ghandi, who was offered the alternative of a fine of £50, elected to go to prison.
