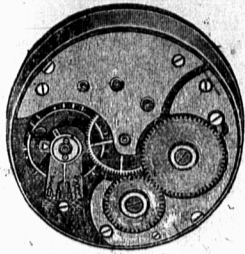

THERE was a large load of freight each way by the City of London between Charlottetown and Craupaud on Saturday. The up cargo consisted of general merchandise while the return cargo consisted of 25 hogs, 12 sheep, 3 cattle, 1 horse, 6 bales and 6 bundles hides, 6 barrels apples, 6 tubs butter, 6 cases eggs and sundry other shipments for local dealers.

THE successful career of Dr. A. Fred Miller, whose card appears in The Guardian of today, is well known to many Charlottetown people among whom he has grown up. Dr. Miller is a son of Lemuel Miller, late Principal of West Kent, and prior to entering upon the study of medicine had valuable experience in a drug store as dispensing clerk. He is a graduate of Dalhousie Medical College, Halifax, where he has made a first class record. He afterwards was selected among the fourth year students of the University as house surgeon in Victoria General Hospital where he practiced for a year. Last May he was appointed surgeon on the S. S. Elinor where he spent five months till the ship laid up here for the winter. He has just returned from a visit to the principal hospitals and will open an office opposite Davis & Fraser's Pork Packing Establishment, Kent street.

THE Minona Publishing Co., Chicago, has just sent forth the first literary venture of Rev. J. M. McLeod, on the history of Presbyterianism in P. E. Island. Mr. McLeod for nearly 12 years was pastor of Brooklyn Presbyterian Church. Twice he labored in P. E. Island for the long period of 18 years in Charlottetown. His book gives a most interesting account of the history of Presbyterianism in twenty congregations. Six sermons are found at the close of the book preached by pioneer only one of whom now lives Rev. Robert Laird. The publishers make the following statement in connection with the work: There is a ways a peculiar interest in the history of beginnings, especially when they are related as in this book from the view point of personal relation. EXCELLENT CONCERT.

Given in Academy of Music Last Evening, by Halifax Ladies.

Miss Lillian Farquhar, in her solo selections, did certainly achieve a decided success. Miss Farquhar's bow work is characterized by a depth of tone and faultless technique not often witnessed in an amateur, but possessed by Miss Farquhar to a remarkable degree. Her playing is brightness itself. Two violin selections were given, the first "Adagio from Concerto," by Max Bruch which was most pleasing. To this an encore was demanded and given, one of Haydn's Hungarian selections. Both of these were delightful. In her second selection, Sarasate's "Zigeunerweisen," a most difficult number was rendered in an excellent manner and called forth deservedly a hearty encore. Miss Farquhar responded with a Serenade from Dohla's selections. Miss Frances Foster whose presence on the stage as a vocalist is always a matter of delight again held her audience enraptured. She appeared on three different occasions, and to each she was compelled to respond with an encore. The beautiful and well trained soprano voice of Miss Foster, so rich so sweet and so strong that she easily filled the Academy, is well known to Halifax music lovers. Miss Foster last evening in every way heightened her present reputation as a vocalist. She sang Donizetti's Italian selection "Onciditi que anima" with "The Captain" for an encore. Lambert's "Forethought" and Rae's "Love's Madrigal" were the second selections, and to these she gave "The low back car" as an encore. An Irish song she had sung with such great favor at the College Glee club the previous evening. Her last number was Saway's "Chanson ancienne" with violin and cello obligato. 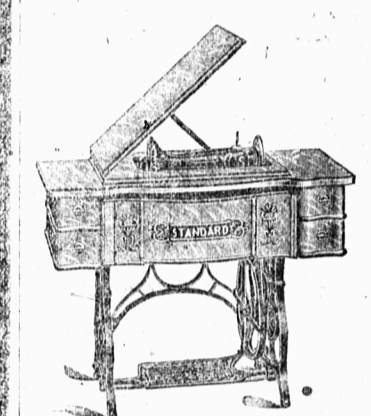
