Word was received by James Honston, Fitzroy St. last night that his son John, a plumber in Boston who fell from a roof in that city and was severely injured is better and hopes are entertained for his recovery. His brother Alfred is now at his bedside. John has been abroad for fourteen years.

There was placed on exhibition in the window of Jamieson's Drug store yesterday three handsome silver cups won by J. Arlison McNeill in bicycle races at Fredericton on Dominion Day. McNeill created a sensation at that city by his speed defeating the fastest riders in the C. W. A. Championship. McNeill is a nephew of Mrs. R. J. Campbell of this city.

The largest afternoon excursion of the season was taken by the City of London to Orwell yesterday afternoon, there being over 200 on board leaving Charlottetown. There also was a full cargo of freight. Charlottetown was reached on the return trip soon after 8 o'clock. The return cargo consisted of 60 cases eggs, 6 boxes butter, 5 pails berries, etc.

An order nisi has been granted by the Chief Justice to remove by certiorari the conviction recently made in the Police Court against George Offer for a third offence against the Prohibition Act. The service of the summons it appears was not personal but was left at the house in Charlottetown and Offer claims he was absent from the Province at the time.
