Synopsis of Canadian North-West Homestead Regulations.

ANY even numbered section of Dominion Lands in Manitoba or the North-West Provinces, containing 8 and 20, not reserved, may be homesteaded by any person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age, to the extent of one-quarter section of 160 acres, more or less.
Entry may be made personally at the land office for the district in which the land is situated, or if the homesteader desires, he may, on application to the Minister of the Interior, Ottawa, the Commissioner of Immigration, Winnipeg, or the local agent receiving authority for some one to make entry on his behalf.

A MEETING of the congregation of Zion Church was held last night to receive the report of the building committee. The matter was generally discussed and an adjournment made to a future date.

The police yesterday afternoon searched the premises of James Steeves on the Malpeque Road, where they found eight barrels of Pilsener beer, one bottle of which they took in order to have it analysed.

THE revival service in the Baptist Church Schoolroom last night was very largely attended. An impressive address was given by Rev. Wm. Dabson, which was followed by a series of brief testimonials and prayers after which a number took the first step for Christ.

The remains of Joseph Gaudet, aged 23, who was killed at Shelburne, N. H., arrived yesterday and were taken to Tignish. The deceased on Sunday last while logging was struck by a piece of lumber which hurled him backward with terrific force. Blood poured from his nostrils and ears and he was picked up unconscious, never breathing again.

AN important decision was given yesterday by Stipendiary McDonald at the Police Court. Some weeks ago in the prohibition case of Jenkins vs Murray the prosecution placed the defendant's wife on the stand. Mr. Mellish for the defendant, objected that the wife was not a competent or compellable witness against her husband. The case was adjourned, and yesterday His Honor delivered a carefully prepared judgment. He held that the Act was a Provincial Criminal Law and came under the Provincial Evidence Act, and that therefore the wife of the accused was not a competent witness. This decision is at variance with what has been recognised as the law heretofore in prohibition or Scott Act cases.

THE Natural History and Antiquarian Society held a most enjoyable and satisfactory meeting last evening when Rev. Robert Pegrum, M.A., read an instructive paper on Edible and Poisonous Fungi. At the conclusion the subject was further enlarged upon by the President, L. W. Watson, Esq., and Messrs. John MacSwain and James Landrigan, who moved and seconded a vote of thanks which was heartily given and suitably acknowledged.

THE meeting of the Study Class of the Historical Society yesterday afternoon was well attended. The president, Miss Anderson, read an interesting paper dealing with the period of the French occupation, compiled from an account written by the late Col. Hunter Duvar. The first mention of distinguished Islanders abroad is given by Cabot who took four of our Indians to England. Mrs. Bruce read an extract from the diary of a French officer's trip up the Hillsboro River from Charlottetown to St. Peters. An animated and instructive discussion followed. The next meeting will be held on Thursday, the 16th inst. at 3.30 p. m. at the residence of Mrs. George Stanley.

A MEETING of the Government was held last night. The hay accounts were brought up and were found to be most satisfactory—the Government will probably lose little or nothing on the transaction. The appointment by the Asylum Trustees of Engineer McPherson was confirmed. In regard to the Hillsboro Bridge it was decided to open correspondence with the Deputy Minister of Railways regarding the approach to the town side of the bridge. It appears that a contract was made for a bridge 18 ft wide; the present structure is 14 feet wide between the supports. The correspondence with Sir Wilfrid Laurier re increased subsidies was read; this matter is approaching a settlement. A number of appointments of Justices of the Peace were made and routine work attended to.

ADDRESS OF WELCOME

Delivered to the Grand Division S. of T. at O'Leary recently by A. J. Matheson. To the Grand Worthy Patriarch, officers, and members of Grand Division of the Sons of Temperance:

We welcome you to O'Leary. You have partaken of our hospitality, you have eaten of our salt and we ask you to remember what that implies. So it gives me much pleasure in welcoming the Grand Division in its first meeting in O'Leary. In coming here you get among a people determined to make this one of the most progressive places in P. E. I. The country here is young but already we have one of the best markets in the province. It is a well known fact that prices were higher here this fall for farm produce such as oats and poultry than anywhere else on the Island. We did well this year and in the words of Israel Tarte "wait till you see us next year."

We are well situated in the midst of a prosperous and rapidly growing community. The wise men of old came from the east, found their desire and worshipped, then returned to their own country. The wise men of today are coming from the east finding their desire and staying with it, so that in the last few years there has been such a demand for furs around here that land has about doubled in value.

Then in a few years we expect to have the winter traffic passing through here. When the politicians begin to consider utility and convenience, the winter route will be the one that presents the best conditions for a steambot making daily round trips. That route, in the opinion of many who have considered the matter, is between Richibucto and the West Shore of P. E. I. Only last spring the West Shore fishermen had their nets out many days before the winter steamers attempted to get into Charlottetown, and Summerside was completely ice bound. Then again by this route and a branch railway to the west shore, Montreal, Quebec, and any towns along the Intercolonial west of Moncton are about two hundred miles nearer Charlottetown.

This distance is a big consideration in freight rates and passenger fares. But enough of that. We also welcome you to a fight seemingly a life long struggle. And it is no easy enemy either but one if the wildest, one of the cruelest that ever ascended from the lower regions to ruin man and destroy the image of God.
