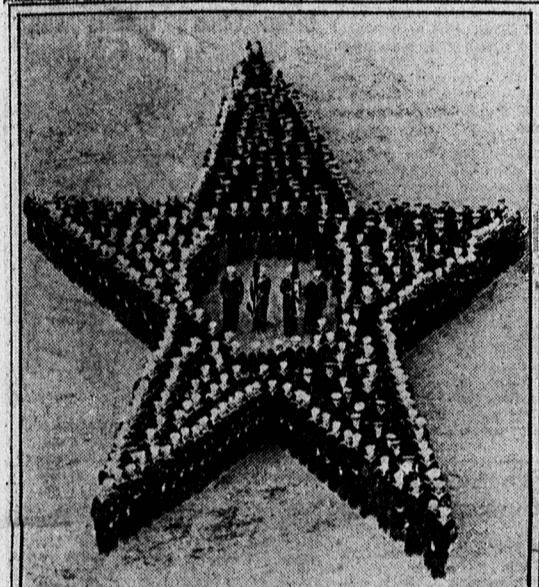
WILL THE ABEGWEITS OVERTAKE A FIVE GOAL LEAD?
