ISLANDERS SAFE.—A comforting message was received in Charlottetown on Saturday from Davenport, England. It was from Lieut. F. B. McTae, who sailed with Canadian troops and read: "Islanders on Scotian Safe." The telegram was addressed to Premier Mathieson.

WOMEN'S INSTITUTES.—There will be a public meeting in Mt. Herbert Hall on the evening of the 21st of October, when Mrs. Dunbrack and Miss Sterns, of the Department of Agriculture, will explain the work of the Women's Institute. A large attendance is expected of residents in this vicinity.

WILL PROBATED.—The estate of the late Mrs (Judge) Hensley has been probated. The estate was valued at \$28,650, and is divided in equal shares among her three daughters, Louisa Catherine McLeod, of Oxtou, England, Katherine Emily Rose, of Halifax, and May E. Longworth, of Charlottetown.

FUNERAL SATURDAY.—The funeral of the late Mrs J. McNally took place on Saturday morning to the pro-cathedral, interment being made in the Catholic Cemetery. At the church a Requiem High Mass was celebrated by Rev. Father P. Duffy, and Father Pius McDonald officiated at the grave.

POLICE COURT.—At the Police Court in Charlottetown, Saturday the Prohibitive case against George Carver, was dismissed. H. Benlot for running an automobile at an illegal rate of speed was fined \$5. W. Chowan, for drunkenness, was sentenced to 20 days in jail with the option of paying a fine.

GOOD CONCERT.—An enjoyable entertainment in aid of the Red Cross, was given in Marshfield Hall on Friday evening, October 16. Much credit is due Mr. and Mrs. Bridges, under whose direction a lengthy programme was carried out. The sum of \$6.55 was realized, and this with other amounts will be forwarded to headquarters.

OF LOCAL INTEREST.—The Campbellton says, Rev. L. L. Young and Mrs. Young sailed from San Francisco on the Pacific mail steamer Manchuria on their return to their mission field in Korea. They have been enjoying a year's furlough in the Maritime Provinces. With them also sailed Rev. and Mrs. E. J. O. Fraser, and Miss Edna Cruikshank, who have recently been appointed to the Korea Mission by the Foreign Mission Board.

BELGIAN RELIEF FUND. On Wednesday evening, October 7th, a meeting in aid of the Belgian Relief Fund was held in Rustico Hall. The meeting was well attended and was presided over by Mr. Felix Gallant. Mr. Peter LeClair was appointed secretary of the meeting. After a few opening remarks by Rev. Dr. Chaisson, the secretary read a circular sent out by the Provincial Committee. In this letter, which depicted in general terms the sufferings and privations of the Belgians, the public were exhorted to contribute whatever they could towards the relief of these poor unfortunates. Mr. John Buntain, M. L. A., then followed with an able discourse giving in brief terms the cause of this terrible war but dwelling more particularly upon the great part these brave and self-sacrificing little nation had played in determining the probable result of this war. He gave a few incidents showing the terrible sufferings to which these poor Belgians had been subjected, and urged the people of Rustico to do all they could to allay the sufferings of a people who had done so much for our Empire and who are now so sadly in need of help. Rev. Dr. Chaisson then followed with an able speech along the same lines as the previous speaker, explaining very clearly how the Belgians had saved the situation by giving time to France and England to mobilize their forces, and he urged all to give generously towards the relief of the starving and poverty stricken Belgians. Mr. Simon Pineault was the next speaker and he also explained the great claim that the Belgian people had upon our charity; it was decided that the work of collecting contributions in money, etc., be left to the teachers of the various districts including Rustico Cross, Dolron's Creek, St. Augustine's Anglo Rustico and Grand Pere Point. The collections will be handed over to Mr. Joseph Gallant merchant, Rustico, who is a member of the Provincial Committee and who will see that these contributions are sent to the proper authorities. It is hoped that the Rustico people will respond generously to the call made upon them. Z.

LONG COURSE.—Arrangements are now being made for the Long Course in Agriculture. The first session will open November 16th, and will continue for a period of five weeks. The next session will open at the same time as the Short Course and will continue for three months. Scholarship of \$30 will be paid to all who complete the course in a satisfactory manner. As only a limited number can be accommodated persons planning to come in should send in their applications to the Department of Agriculture as soon as possible.

THE POTATO CROP.—The potato crop in Prince Edward Island is much larger than usual and the quality is excellent. There is scarcely any sign whatever of rot. There is, however, some danger of powdery scab affecting the market. Mr John Adams has been sent to this province by the Department of Agriculture to inform the farmers of the best means of getting rid of this disease. He will speak at Montserrat on Monday evening, Souris on Tuesday and at St Peters on Wednesday evening. All meetings will begin at 7:30 p.m. Everyone interested is invited to be present.

GRAHAM'S ROAD.—Potato digging is the order of the day in Graham's Road and vicinity. The crop is averaging about 250 bushels to the acre and 30 cart loads is the average day's digging for each farmer. Most of the potatoes are already dug, the weather for the past weeks having been ideal, and farmers declare the crops all around have been bumper ones for which the farmers have every reason to be thankful, and liberal to those in need. Surely no farmer enjoying such a bountiful harvest and "Seeing his neighbor (in Europe) have need, would shut up his bowels of compassion toward him." "If such there be, go mark him well!" etc.—L.

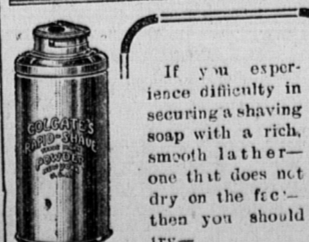

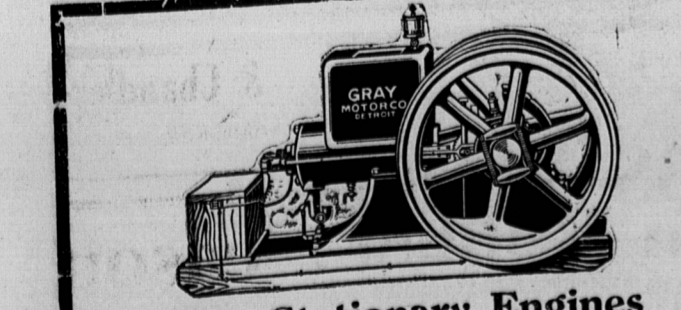
