South was guilty on two counts in today's deal: one in the bidding; the other in the play.

Even at match-point duplicate, South should have been quite satisfied to let his partner play seven spades. If a grand slam is bid on a lead, it is not often necessary to have the contract at the highest denomination!

West, leading against seven no-trump, shrewdly selected his top spade, rather than give declarer a free finesse by leading away from a queen. South took the first trick with his spade ten, then, after long thought, laid down the heart king. The queen not falling, he ran the rest of the spades, discarding a diamond, two hearts and the club jack from his own hand, and obviously staking everything on the favorable position of the heart queen. The finesse for that card failed, and it was all over.
