THE METRIC SYSTEM.

More than a century ago France adopted the metric system, which in its simplest terms is the application of the decimal system to weights, measures and coinage. The system commends itself to the reason and the sense of convenience of all who are acquainted with it. After our experience with dollars and cents in currency, pounds, shillings, pence and farthings. What the decimal system has done in coinage and currency the metric system proposes to effect in all measures and weights, except measures of time.

The metric system is now in general use in almost all countries except those where the English language is spoken. Its use is permissible in England and has been legalised in the United States and Canada. It is now almost universally in use for scientific measurement, and for that reason all young persons should learn it. One cannot read a volume of science in these days intelligibly without a knowledge of the terms of the metric system in measures of length, superficial area, capacity, and weight. It is a great pity that all the world had not the metric system from the first.

Why has not the English-speaking world adopted it? Mainly because of the cost and trouble of making the change and partly because of the conservatism of the Mother Country, which still clings to pounds, shillings and pence. The world pays dearly for its mistakes, for the curse of Babel, for the righting of things wrongly begun and wrongly established. Not without enormous cost can all the measures, weights, dials, tools, models and equipment of all the industries of the English speaking world be changed. We must unlearn the old, which is as hard as to learn the new. The change must run through the school books, the very thought of the people, and the Legislatures and Parliaments must change many laws to fit the new conditions.

We must no longer measure distance in miles, furlongs, rods, feet and inches but in kilometers, hectometers, decameters, meters, decimeters, centimeters and so on. John Jones, if he would sell and convey his farm to Tom Brown must deed so many hectares and ares of land. If you sell or buy fluids, you must deal in liters, hectoliters, kiloliters. If you deal in sale or purchase by weight you must talk in kilograms, hectograms, grams or centigrams. And the grocer, and the druggist and all who sell and buy must have these weights and measures, and all present weights and measures must be discarded as useless. All these names of

weights and measures are scientific, but they are hard to learn, and the change will be more costly and revolutionary than would at first appear.

A dearth of candidates for the Rhodes scholarships is complained of by the New York Sun. There is no scarcity of that kind in Canada.

More big supplementary estimates are brought down in Parliament. The estimates of this year claim the doubtful distinction of being "vaster than have been."
