LONDON, March 2 (AP) - Moscow announced tonight that the Red Army captured 30 companies in a drive toward Narva on the great trunk railway to Warsaw, while northward around the Estonian stronghold of Narva the Russians advanced aiming at the capture of the city. The capture of Narva would mean the severing of the Red Army's main line of communication with the Baltic states.
