NEW RULE HOLD ENGAGE IN GUN PIRATE STORY: OVER 75,000 BRITISH FIGHT WITH POLICE PROBED AND VERIFIED

United States Consulates Stormed By Emigrants Who Seek Visa Certificates

London, July 14.—The new American immigration regulations became effective much to the distress of 75,000 British subjects who had bought steamship tickets and to the financial disappointment of steamship companies which had sold storage space to that number of passengers.

For weeks American consulates in the United Kingdom have been besieged by prospective immigrants who have cited their steamship tickets as full and sufficient reasons that they be permitted to travel to the United States.

But the new method of handling emigrants requires that anybody desiring to go to America for indefinite residence shall write to the nearest American Consul, from whom he will receive an appointment to appear before the Consul for a visa.

As for the quota is concerned, there will be no detention, inasmuch as only a sufficient number of visa certificates to carry the quota will be granted. The quota for Great Britain and Ulster is 34,007, of which 10 per cent. will be granted visa certificates monthly.
