virtue of an act passed by the former Government. The valuers are appointed to fix true and proper valuations, and it is not true to say that they have been instructed to increase or decrease the valuation on any farm lands. If they make mistakes, the law that was passed the year before we came into power provides for a remedy; and WHEN THE LEADER OF THE OPPOSITION MAKES THE STATEMENT THAT IT INVOLVES AN INCREASE IN TAXATION OF 33 PER CENT. HE IS MAKING A STATEMENT THAT HAS NO FOUNDATION IN FACT OR TRUTH. IT IS A SHAMEFUL THING THAT IN THIS HOUSE WE SHOULD HAVE HON. MEMBERS WHO WOULD RISE IN THEIR PLACES AND ABUSE THEIR POSITION TO ORIGINATE AND GIVE CIRCULATION TO STATEMENTS SO FAR AT VARIANCE WITH THE TRUTH. THERE IS ABSOLUTELY NO TRUTH IN THE STATEMENT THAT THE INTENTION IS TO EFFECT AN INCREASE IN TAXATION. Whether the result may be an increase or a decrease no man can tell until the final adjustments are made. Some case of over-valuation and some of under-valuation may arise, because no man can be perfect in his judgment; and even so, many would be dissatisfied. When that Act went into force under the former Government I came into this building for purposes of business and the place was seething with a mass of people who had come in to protest against the grave injustice from which they were suffering from that valuation. I could hardly find my way into the hall for the people who were protesting against the valuation. Some of those mistakes were rectified and some were not, and every time a re-valuation was made there were people who were dissatisfied; and every time a re-valuation is made by virtue of that Act, men who do not regard truth can say that it is made for the purpose of increasing taxation. On the top of this, they say we are proposing to put a tax on farms. ONE WOULD SUPPOSE THE TAXES BORE ON NO OTHER CLASS OF PEOPLE, WHILE NOT MORE THAN ONE THIRD WOULD REST ON FARM LANDS; THE REST WOULD BE DISTRIBUTED IN THE VARIOUS CLASSES OF TAXATION, ON THE DIFFERENT SUBJECT-MATERS OF TAXATION. THE BANKS WOULD PAY THEIR SHARE, THE INCOME TAX PEOPLE WOULD PAY THEIRS, AND THE CORPORATIONS. THE BURDEN WILL FALL JUST WHERE THE PRESENT TAX ACTS PLACE THAT BURDEN; AND IT IS A REMARKABLE THING WHICH MEMBERS ON THE OTHER SIDE OF THE HOUSE MIGHT DO WELL TO KEEP IN MIND, THAT ALMOST EVERY TAX ON THE STATUTE BOOK WAS IMPOSED DURING THE TIME THEIR PARTY WAS IN POWER.

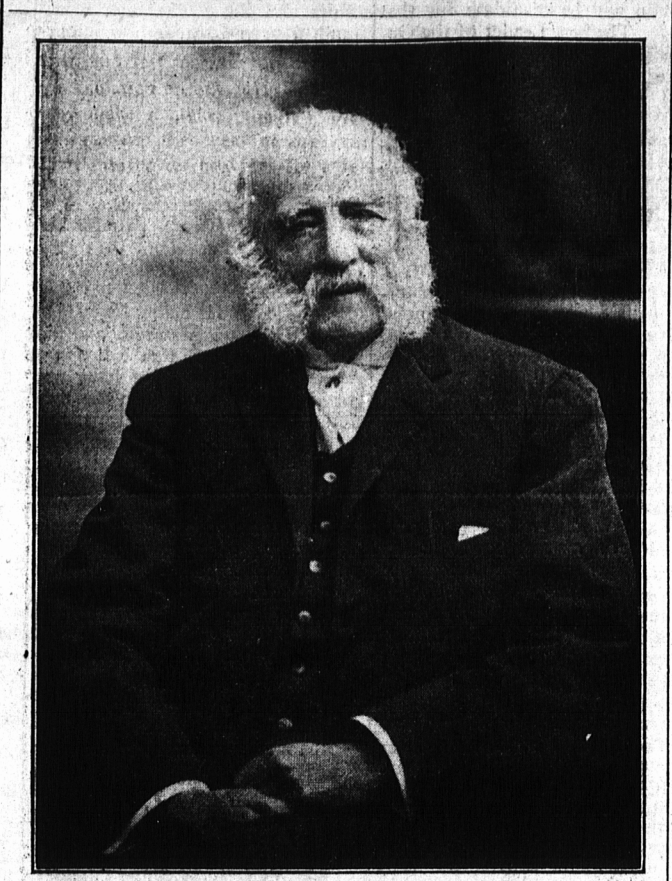
The fox tax is merely a substitution for what they had imposed as an income tax, and as a subdivision of that class, so that that is not new. THE TAXES ARE THEIR TAXES, PASSED DURING THEIR TIME AND CARRIED INTO EFFECT DURING THEIR REGIME, AND NOW THAT THEY THINK IT SUITS THEIR PURPOSE, THEY CONDEMN THE WHOLE SYSTEM WHICH ORIGINATED AND WAS CONDUCTED BY THEM. The first statement contained in the resolution moved by the Leader of the Opposition is not true. In the session which closed last spring, this statement was made, as it is made by every cheap political jack in the country, that the Government is extravagant. It is a poor, worn-out, hackneyed thing. When it came to the test and members opposite were asked to put their

finger on a single item of expenditure which was wasteful, what were they able to do? They made an absolute failure so far as that is concerned. The public accounts were thrown open to them, and the Public Accounts Committee was organized and went to work. On the Committee, from the Opposition, were two of the most reliable men that suggested themselves at that time. The Committee brought down its report, and in that there is no reference to a single dollar of money mis-spent. But this cheap statement, that money is wasted, is easily made. The Junior Member for West River says the officials are fairly falling over each other. I do not see anything like that. We used to think, when the hon. gentleman was a member of the Government, that there were many officials at that time that might be dispensed with. Always, when the Government was in power, some of those officials were so near to the hon. gentleman that it was a profit to him to have them here. He tells us about a tax being placed on the officials of Alberta. So there is; and if he will look at the salaries of those officials he will find they are five to six times as great as the salaries paid in this province. The combined salary of Premier and Attorney General here is not as large as that of the head clerk there. Well might they afford to pay their tax. His proposition is that there should be a special tax placed on the officials in this building,—men who can barely live on the small salaries they receive now. He would tax them, but would allow men with large incomes and great means to pass unscathed, or would leave it to their choice to do their duty or not. The poor man working here for five or six hundred a year would be burdened heavily. Those who derive higher salaries are paying more by far out of their incomes by voluntary contribution to the Patriotic Fund than the taxation imposed by the province of Alberta. They say, we believe in giving to the Patriotic Funds. Although the Leader of the Opposition says that at one moment, yet he professes to quote a man on the street who says the opposite; so that he may go in one place and say "In the House I was in favour of contribution to the Patriotic Fund," and go in another place and quote his speech to show he was opposed to it. That method may pass perhaps in a sordid way for a while, but its end is early and its destruction complete. With one breath he would pay to the Patriotic Fund, with another breath he says some person tells him that no such tax would be lawful. I don't know who his legal advisers are; but if they cannot give him better advice than that he had better change them and rely on his own unaided instinct for his legal views. They would contribute money, but they say, don't pay it now; borrow it. Let us see where that puts those gentlemen.

BORROWING—AN EVASION OF DUTY.

Our men who are going to the battlefield are paying their lives "in cash."
No shirking or postponing, for them, of the risk of their lives. They are paying it now.
We who are at home should bear some share as well.
What is the manly proposition that comes from the other side of the House?
What is the honourable and patriotic proposition?
That we who stay at home should shirk!
That we should cast the burden, which we are in honour bound to bear, on the next generation!
Those soldiers who survive and return are younger men than we; let them fight and when they come back bear the burden of taxation as well.
That is the gospel of the shirker, and that is precisely the proposition that comes from the other side of the House.
I appeal to hon. members of the Opposition, some of whom are as loyal as the King himself, if they think that it is their duty that devolves upon us this day, to borrow the money to meet urgent and immediate needs of the war and to leave it as an added burden on the shoulders of our returning soldiers?
Those who stay at home would avoid service, and when it comes to the payment of money they can shirk it. And yet that is what the Leader of the Opposition proposes.
In Great Britain they are paying up to 25 per cent. of their income and even beyond that for war purposes. The estimate is that the

contributions by the people are now amounting to twenty-five percent. of whatever their income may be, and from whatever source derived; and we are just as responsible as they.
They are borrowing money for carrying on the war; but for the purpose of maintaining the Patriotic Fund and those other special funds, what other nation is borrowing?
What other people are borrowing?
They are paying as far as they can pay, and the loans that are being raised are for the general purposes of the war.
Canada is raising those loans, and we will leave to the coming generation all the burden that they should bear.
That policy of borrowing money and going into a debt is not for a nation, except when driven to it by necessity, the spendthrift's course.
When the Leader of the Opposi-

now, they say, when the rates of interest are ruinously high and borrow money.

I leave that policy to the country to judge. They tell us to spend forty or fifty thousand, and if the revenue will not stand it and we know perfectly well that the revenue cannot stand a dollar of that—we are to borrow money at enormous war rates and leave it as an added burden.
There is not a man of sense from one end of the province to the other, who will not condemn such a reckless policy and those who advocate it as utterly incompetent. We are to borrow forty or fifty thousand when a loan can be floated with the greatest difficulty; and every man who votes for the resolution moved by the Leader of the Opposition votes for that ruinous course. If they vote for it their names will go down to the future as those of men who shirked their duty and refused to give the people an opportunity of doing theirs.

THE EVILS OF BORROWING.

We have enough to meet this year. We have the first mortgage that was ever placed upon this Island. It was placed by the Leader of the Opposition and those who were with him at that time. That mortgage falls due next December, and so improvident were those men that the whole of that \$185,000 had attached to it a sinking fund that accounts for very little more than one-third, and even that sinking fund was invested in securities that are far from matur-

ing still and cannot be cashed except at ruinous rates.

That is what borrowing does for the country.

The Leader of the Opposition's policy, and the policy of every one who will vote for this resolution, is the policy of putting on another mortgage.

If we went into the market now for a further loan added to the mortgage we have already to meet, it would cost us not only the ordinary rate of interest which borrowing countries now have to pay, but it would be surcharged with a further sum, because we would be told that we have adopted a policy of going further into debt, of borrowing money on a mortgaged province, which is not good business.

When members rise in their places and vote yea or nay on this resolution, they will vote either against it and for a policy of sound finance, or they will vote in condemnation of a call that is made on the people, AND WHICH THE PEOPLE WILL WILLINGLY ANSWER, to make a small contribution towards present urgent needs.

The proposition of the Leader of the Opposition is to float debentures—forty year debentures—on a war market.
