## OPIUM BARRED FROM MEDICINE

OTTAWA, July 15.—In the Senate this morning on motion for second reading of the Patent Medicine Bill, Senator Roy gave notice of an amendment declaring that no patent medicine containing opium or any of its derivatives should be sold. From his medical experience he would say that more than three were killed by patent medicines loaded with opium than were killed by any disease. It was a terrible thing to see a mother giving a child a mixture which would cause the death or physical ruin of the child. The taste for drugs was often begun in childhood. The importation, manufacture and sale of opium in Canada was being prohibited, but the prohibition would amount to nothing if the patent medicines he referred to were not also prohibited. Parliament was forbidding cigarettes sixteen-year-old boys, and he thought it only reasonable that it should prohibit opium and morphine to infants. The bill was given second reading.

## BRIDGE BURNED NEAR EMBURN

OTTAWA, July 16.—A bridge on the Ottawa and New York railway, two miles north of Emburn, about twenty-five miles from Ottawa, was totally destroyed by fire Saturday night. It is supposed to have been set fire by a spark from the engine of the special train returning to the city from Cornwall with the Le-Croix excursionists on board. The bridge was about 100 feet long, and 30 feet in height.

A gang of men were sent down from the city, and started the work of reconstruction early on Sunday. The officials reported last night that they expect trains could cross by seven o'clock this morning, so that the traffic would not be interrupted. The bridge was a wooden structure, and will be replaced by an iron one.

### HINDOO SERVANT.

LONDON, July 18.—Excellent servant as the Indian is in many respects, honesty is not one of his qualities, and he has to be strictly looked after when either money or property is entrusted to him. A mistress cannot go into her kitchen, consult the cook as to what the meals should be and should be ordered from the shops and leave the rest to him. She has to give him out from her locked up stores every spoonful of everything that is required for the day's cooking, else the goods would be sold outside.

Distillers, the name in India for every description of kitchen and pantry and stable work, have to be dolled out every day or every two days, he soiled ones being counted and doctored up till they are given to the froil (washerwoman) who must not be allowed to keep the clothes of the household longer than is absolutely necessary or he will let them out to his friends for small sums—silk and woolen undergarments in the cold weather, so that holes appear in unaccounted places.

A kitchen-gar (table servant) would be observed to wear a pair of cotton socks one day, silk ones the next, woolen ones the next, not belonging to his master—detention would be too easy in that case—but hired for some one else's hob at a price of (a farthing) a pair. As the house servants of course never wear shoes in the coors the stockings suffer considerably.

The cook goes to the bazaar every morning to buy meat, fish, ghee (olive butter), vegetables—all the food in fact that cannot be stored, and his book as he might for inspection every day or else expenses would increase in a surprising manner. He of course pockets a percentage on all he spends: that is dastur, the custom of the country, and so long as it does not exceed an anna in the rupee, six and a quarter percent, no one objects. ## BAD GANGS ARE IN MONTREAL

MONTREAL, July 16.—The flow of criminals to Quebec for the tercentenary is proving an awkward thing for Montreal and operations en route seem to be the proper thing in criminal life. The murder in an opium dive recently broke up one gang of thieves and pickpockets, but another has been landing hard on Montrealers for the past week. Citizens have been held up in broad day light by the gang in quiet localities and people are terrorized. The latest case reported to the police is that of a lady visitor from London, Eng., who was going up Cedar avenue, off Pine avenue, with her little boy yesterday afternoon when she was set upon and throttled and her handbag containing about \$100 taken. Holdups occurred last Tuesday, Friday and Saturday and the police are convinced they are the work of the same gang.

## AFFILIATION WITH LAVAL

MONTREAL, July 16.—A school for higher education of women is about to be founded by the Rev. Sisters of the Congregation of Notre Dame, and in the same way as the Royal Victoria College is affiliated with the university of McGill it is more than probable that the proposed institution will be connected in a like manner with Laval. The new school which will be opened in the month of October next, room being provided in the Mother House of Ladies of the Congregation now being completed on Sherbrooke street west.

experience that one gets to know proper prices, and newcomers are woefully imposed upon, one or two hundred percent being often charged. The cook arranges his prices to suit the circumstances of his master, and as soon as promotion with increased pay comes up goes every-thing, so that a colonel's beef or mutton costs more than a major's or captain's, a captain's than a subaltern's, though there may be no change at all in the style of living or in the number of the family.

In the civil service the same thing happens. The pay of every post in the various services is published in the official lists, and the servants know to a halfpenny what their masters get. Some ladies try to do their own marketing, but things are always much dearer for them than for natives in the bazaar, so that there is no advantage in it, and it is, besides, extremely disagreeable, for the less one sees of the stalls there, particularly the meat stalls, the better.

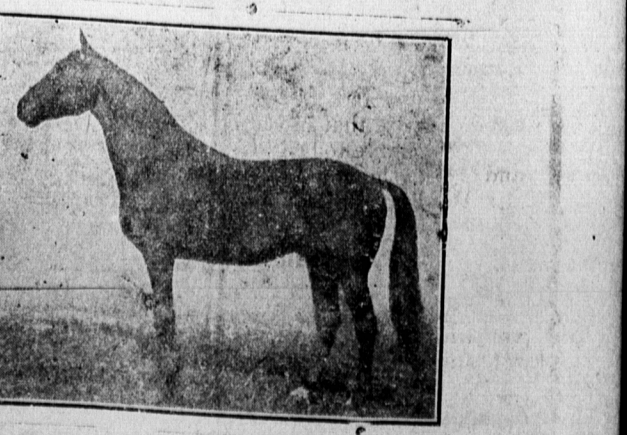
