RUSSIAN SCOTTISH CABLE NOW LAID.

CHRISTIANIA, Norway, May 11--In an article which appeared recently in The Morgenblad some interesting information is given with regard to the work of linking up Scotland with Russia by cable.

Information which had been received from Alexandrow, it was stated, confirmed the rumors previously circulated that a cable had been laid between Great Britain and Russia. The work was surely, the article continued, one of the finest and most wonderful technical undertakings ever achieved, and gave some idea of the vast resources of the belligerent powers.

The cable was laid from Peterhead in Scotland to Alexandrow on the Murman coast, and the work did not occupy more than nine days. The big cable steamer, the Colonia, which performed the task, steamed at the rate of 8 1/2 knots during the entire voyage and was escorted by the Wilson liner Eskimo, which, previous to the outbreak of the war, was employed in the regular service between Christiania and Hull, but was now acting as auxiliary cruiser. The completion of the task at Alexandrow was graphically described by the telegraphic correspondence between the two countries now takes place over this line.

The administration is British, and 25 English employees who made the voyage on board the Colonia are engaged on the work at Alexandrow.

FROM THE FIRING LINE

The following letter from the firing line in the western zone of battle was received by Miss Mary McInnis, City, from her brother Charles McInnis who is a driver in the Ammunition Column of the First Canadian Contingent. It is dated at the Front, April 23rd.

Dear Sister:--Just a few lines to let you know that I received the parcel of tobacco. It was very welcome to me and my comrades, as we had not had any for a long time.

We have just been through a terrible time, especially these last few days. You will see the casualty list soon. It is fierce I can tell you. We make three trips every day and night with ammunition and the sight of the dead and wounded, many bodies of which both men and horses we have to drive over, is something appalling. Often we have to drop flat on the ground, because every time a shell or bomb explodes it is awful.

I saw Jack McKenna the other day. He is well. He had just lost his kit in action. I have not seen Bob Trainor since the battle. I feel very uneasy about Bob.

You will see an account of the last big battle that is going on now in the papers later. We are waiting to be called out to go up again. I will write again after it is over. The Germans are shelling a town now, and the shells are passing right over our heads. They don't know that we are on this billet, or they would be after us.

I am all right so far. Hoping everybody is well, goodbye. Your loving brother, CHARLES.
