CASH FOR CHRISTMAS SHOPPING WILL BE PAID TO MEMBERS

OTTAWA, Dec. 14.—When members of Parliament leave here for the Christmas holiday they will take with them more money than they expected for their Christmas shopping. It is understood that cheques to cover 23 days' allowance out of their \$4,000 per session will be issued by the Treasury. This covers the period to Dec. 31. and presumably will be reckoned as about one-fourth of the prescribed minimum terms of 90 days.

NEW TARIFF DIVERTS GOODS TO DOMINION

An important tariff amendment designed to encourage shipping via Canadian ports will come into effect on January 1. Change in Act Under this amendment subsection one of section three, the customs tariff act of 1907, is repealed, and the following substituted. "The rates of customs duties, if any, set forth in column one, 'British Preferential Tariff' shall apply to goods the produce or manufacture of the following British countries when conveyed without transshipment from a part of any British country enjoying the benefits of the British preferential tariff into a sea or river port of Canada. Here follows a list of British countries and the amendment continues: "Provided, however, that goods entitled to the benefits of the British preferential tariff shall be accorded such benefits when such goods are shipped on a through bill of lading consigned to a consignee in a specified port in Canada when such goods are transferred at a port of a British colony or possession not enjoying the benefits of the British preferential tariff, and conveyed without further transshipment
