**Western Oils Active On Toronto Market**

TORONTO, Aug. 5—(CP)—Volume improved but with the exception of the western oils, activated by bullish news over the week-end from Leduc Fields, prices sagged on the Toronto Stock Exchange today. Mining issues eased off in majority although selected issues held.  
The exchange's closing index listed gains up .02 to 106.71, with metals down .27 to 82.82 and western oils up .85 to 30.12.  
Features in the western oils list were Okalta, up .24 at \$1.40 on about 50,000 shares turnover, and Globe Oil, up .10 at 96 on 81,000 shares. Other gainers were Coastal, Calgary and Edmonton, Calmont, Davis Petroleum, Nordon Oil, Pacific Petroleum.  
Senior golds listed three changes two up and one down. Kerr Addison closed 1-4 higher at 15 1-8 and Wright-Hargreaves 4 at \$3.00 with McIntyre down 1-8 at 60 7-8. In the junior list losses outnumbered gains by about three to two but the range was narrow and turnover relatively light. Better issues were Croinor, Kenville, Lunward, MacLeod, Orlac, San Antonio, Sullivan and losers included Duquesne, East Maratic, Giant, Little Long Lac, Madson, Maratic, Norzone, O'Brien, Ogama, Taku.  
Rudson Bay, down 1-8 at 43 3-8 led base metals losers followed by smelters 1-2 at 86 1-2, Nickel 1-4 at 33 1-4, Falconbridge, MacDonald, Walte Amulet, Sherritt advanced 15 at \$3.66, Okalo 5 1-4 at \$9 1-2.

**N. Y. Stocks In Half-hearted Recovery Move**

(By Victor Eubank)  
NEW YORK, Aug. 5—(AP)—Stocks negotiated a half-hearted recovery today behind selected metals, steel rails and assorted industrials although dealers remained relatively sluggish and many market leaders failed to participate.  
The Associated Press 60-stock composite was up 3 of a point at 63.6 regaining half of the loss of the preceding session. It was the narrowest market since June 30.  
Unchanged at noon, McIntyre closed off 3-8. Distillers Seagrains added to an early fractional gain to close up 3-8. Canadian Pacific added 1-8.  
Packard Motors continued the liveliest mover on 43,000 shares and finished off 1-8 at 4 7-8, a bottom for 1947. The company reported a substantial loss for the first six months.  
Prisco Railroad Common, second most active on 23,600 shares, added 1-4 to 10 1-4 and the Preferred 3 at 30 1-2 on word a merger with Gulf Mobile and Ohio was being contemplated. Chesapeake & Ohio jumped better than 2 points and closed up 7-8 at 48 1-8 when directors voted to distribute the road's holdings of Nickel Plate Common to stock owners. The latter issue dropped 2-4 at 30 but Nickel Plate Preferred was up 1 1-2 at 109 1-2.  
On 1 to 2 were Bethlehem 80 3-8, U. S. Steel 73 5-8, Montgomery Ward 1-2, Allied Chemical 192, U. S. Gypsum 101, Du Pont 1 and American Woolen 44 3-8. Improved were Chrysler, General Motors, Studebaker, Goodrich, U. S. Rubber, International Harvester, American Water Works, Union Carbide, Southern Pacific and Northern Pacific.  
On the offside were Sears Roebuck, American Telephone, Boeing United Aircraft, Kennecott, Westinghouse, American Can, Johns-Manville, Southern Railway, Standard Oil (NJ) and Commonwealth and Southern.

**Paper Stocks Up On Montreal Market**

MONTREAL, Aug. 5—(CP)—Papers displayed rising tendencies, and industrials and mines were about mixed in light trading on the Montreal Stock Exchange and Curb Market here today. Price changes were mostly fractional and the list scattered. Prices slightly outnumbered minus. Closing averages of the Montreal exchange listed papers up 3.30 to 348.29; industrials up 0.2 to 121.7; utilities off 0.1 to 77.7; banks off 0.08 to 27.06 and golds up 0.40 to 73.17. Volume of the industrial group was weak with sales of 23,000 shares boarded. Mines continued dull with turnover totaling 69,300 shares.  
The paper section was generally quiet. St. Lawrence Corp. "A" advanced 1-4 at 44. Consolidated, heavily traded, rose 1-4 at 18 1-2 and Donnocona, moderately active, increased 3-8 at 19. International was the sole loser in papers registering a loss of 1-4 at 49 1-2.  
In industrials, firming tendencies prevailed. Algoma, active throughout the day, climbed 1-2 at 39 1-2 while Commercial Alcohol increased 1-8 at 5 1-4. Extremely active Rand, buoyant for the last few days, advanced 3-8 at 6. Canadian Car "A" and standard Chemicals were firm.  
Brand and Millen "A" boarded a 10 cent loss at 1.50 in the industrial section while Imperial Tobacco decreased 3-4 at 15.  
Southmount remained unchanged in utilities.  
In mines, Consolidated Central Cadillac, actively traded, climbed 3-4 at 25 3-4. Formacue increased 2 cents at 27 and Sherritt Gordon gained 5 cents at 3.55. Lindeite was a loss of 1-4 at 18 1-2. Quebec Yellowknife one cent at 18 and Pitt 1-2 cent at 15 1-2. O'Brien dropped one cent at 208.  
International Nickel advanced 1-4 at 33 1-2 in metals.  
Homestead, extremely active, advanced 5 cents at 37 in oils. Okalta, heavily traded, rose 22 cents at 1.40. McColl Frontenac slipped 1-2 cent at 28.  
Canadian Breweries lost 1-8 at 25 in Alcoloha. Famous Players was firm at 17 in another group.  
Trading box score: Stocks traded 146, higher 55, lower 38, unchanged 53, new highs 5 and new lows 8.
