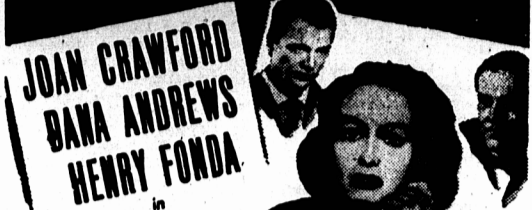

In an interview Smallwood said the Canadian Government could not ignore the facts that a majority of Newfoundlanders had voted for confederation in yesterday's referendum and that proposed terms of union already had been laid down.

"What is Canada to do," he asked. "Is she just to ignore our majority in the popular vote and the sweeping majority we had by districts? Can she ignore the proposed terms of union?"

"She made them and a majority of the people want them. That is how Mr. King's own Government works—by majority no matter how big or small."

Police May Lay Charge Today In Bergman Case

A charge of illegal possession of intoxicating liquor under the new Temperance Act will be laid against Walter Bergman of Traveller's Rest and Toronto in the near future, possibly today, it was learned last evening.

It is believed that Mr. Bergman left his summer residence at Traveller's Rest yesterday for Toronto but that he will return to face trial whenever he is charged.

The case, which has aroused much interest locally, arose out of a seizure made at the Bergman Travellers Rest home on Monday by members of the Summerside detachment, R.C.M.P. According to a statement given out later by Supt. N. Anderson of the R.C.M.P., "sixteen quart bottles of assorted spirits and one part case of ale were seized. Only two of the bottles of spirits bore Prince Edward Island vendor's labels".

The next day Mr. Bergman had Sgt. D. J. Heath and Cst. Leo Lauman of the Summerside detachment arrested under the action against the two Mounties for \$10,000 damages for alleged illegal trespass, claiming that they exceeded their authority and that because they had no search warrant their entry into his dwelling was illegal.

They were released shortly afterwards on \$10,000 bail each. The Act states that the Sheriff may release persons arrested in this manner when bail is put up for the amount of the suit.

This action will come before the Supreme Court and if a jury trial is chosen it will likely take place at the next sitting of the Court in Summerside in November. If the case is heard before a judge only it could take place at a special sitting earlier in the fall.

Mansfield, O., Reformatory — where both West and Daniels had been prisoners — was slaughtered along with his wife and 21-year-old daughter. In jail today Daniels said the hell out of him.

He (West) got a hard time from Niebel while he was in the reformatory.

The Niebel family was kidnapped before dawn and their nude bodies were found in a cornfield. As the "heat" went on, West and Daniels became more desperate. Last night, farmer James Smith, 25, of Tiffin, O., was murdered in his automobile when he objected to the men taking his driver's licence. Smith's wife was a helpless witness. The couple were en route home after an evening at an ice cream parlor.

Two hours later came the seventh slaying. Also at Tiffin, 85-miles east of Van Wert, the gunmen killed Orville Taylor, 28, of Niles, Mich., to obtain his drive-away truck, loaded with four cars.

Former Army Flier Admits "Bombing"

(By The Associated Press) NEW HAVEN, Conn., July 23—The former United States army flier who dropped a missile near United Nations headquarters surrendered today and said he is anxious to return to Lake Success to "finish my fight for world peace."

With the same dramatic suddenness with which he appeared over Lake Success yesterday, the 36-year-old Ashford, Conn., flier, Stephen J. Sypin, walked into the newsroom of the New Haven Register, identified himself and suggested that he be turned over to the police.

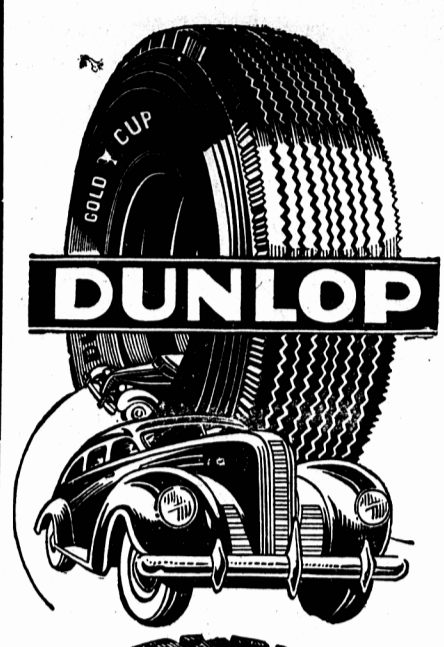

West and Daniels were in the truck when they were stopped by a roadblock. Sheriff Roy Shaffer of Van Wert County halted the truck and asked West if he had any passengers. Shaffer was "covered" with a tommy gun by Sgt. L.D. Conn, 42, of the Van Wert Police. When Shaffer discovered Daniels crouching down in the cab, West came out shooting. He severely wounded Conn and game protector Frank A. Fritsch, 55, before Conn, lying in the high-way, shot him between the eyes.

Daniels, although he had a rifle and two pistols lying beside him, put up his hands and crawled out. West died en route to hospital. Daniels was put in the county jail. A crowd of several hundred persons milled around the jail with yells of: "Hang the rat! Kill him now! Let us have him!" Daniels, police said, regained

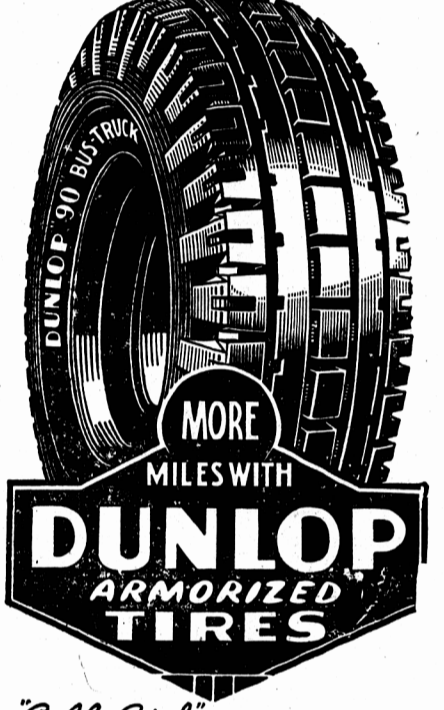
