NEWS FROM DEMARARA OF MISSIONARIES

Extracts from a letter from Rev. A. Lucas, Secy International Sabbath School Association.

Dear Mr. James:—I have recently been in Demerara where I visited Mr. and Mrs. Mackenzie. Please tell your Sabbath School that in my work I spend two or three weeks per year in British Guiana, and take a deep interest in their mission to the many thousands of East Indians in that Colony.

You will be glad to know that Mr. Mackenzie has become moderately strong since his late illness, though not yet up to his full Canadian strength. The climate is a trying one, but not beset with the excessive dangers which many people in the north have heard of.

Your missionary lot of land is on a plain, or savannah, on the border of the city of Georgetown, with an excellent road running in front of it. Beyond the road is a trench of water—a common method of draining in that country—and, on small land plots beyond the trench, there live many East Indians, in such little huts as your Sunday School scholars have never seen. I wish they could see the little building which Mr. Mackenzie has erected. It is smaller and more temporary looking than any country church in P. E. Island.

Before the building was ready the East Indian children came with slate and book. This showed the need and the opportunity for Christian work. Would your scholars like to see these fifty or more small, bronze skinned, children with glossy black hair? They are very sparsely clad, having on only a shirt or pinafore, and perhaps that was sent by your missionary workers. They are eager to learn, and the parents are desirous they should learn English. Probably most of these parents are heathens yet. Mr. Mackenzie has not yet had time to master the language, and his first efforts are in a broken patois, sometimes called "pidgin English." Beginnings in Mission work are slow and have many difficulties. I hope some day the work, now small, will become a great strong school, and a preaching centre, as the East Indian work in Trinidad has become.

I wish the ladies of your Mission Societies could understand Mrs. Mackenzie's position in the work. Of course she cannot yet do much except personal work with East Indian women and children who have "broken English." This may mean more than any of the ladies (or ministers' wives),

in the north are doing. Personal work with individuals is an important item on a Mission field, and might be made more important on the home field also. Much can be done to cheer and encourage her by kindly Christian letters. Then children's picture books, Sunday School picture rolls &c, as well as garments, would be serviceable things, and would enable Mrs. Mackenzie to bless these children, and to "brighten their homes. Eastern children love bright colors, and simple gifts will draw them to work.

I have written only of Mr. Mackenzie's work, though I am more intimately acquainted with your other missionaries, Messrs Cropper and Fisher, and their schools, and with your Trinidad Mission. Tell your people that these fields are sadly undermanned. "The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few." I do trust that you may all hear the call to enlarge your operations in behalf of that interesting people.

Referring to the foregoing letter Mr. Mackenzie is planning for a larger and more substantial building on the other half of the lot referred to, which will be at once a school, and a preaching station. Contributions in aid of this building, which promises so well, will be thankfully received.
