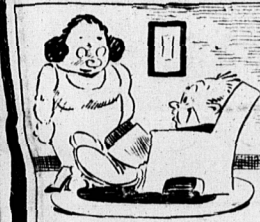

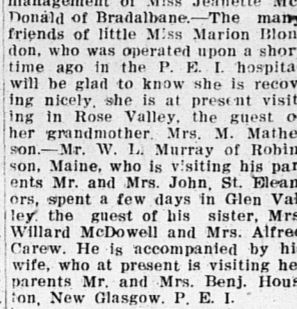

FRIDERICHTON, N. B., Sept. 15.—At the request of the Attorney-General's Department of the Province of Quebec, arrangements are being made today by Dr. T. Carleton Allen, deputy Attorney-General for New Brunswick, for the exhumation of the body of Abraham Galt, who died at Almaville, Que., supposedly from an attack of acute indigestion, for an autopsy for the purpose of definitely determining the cause of death.

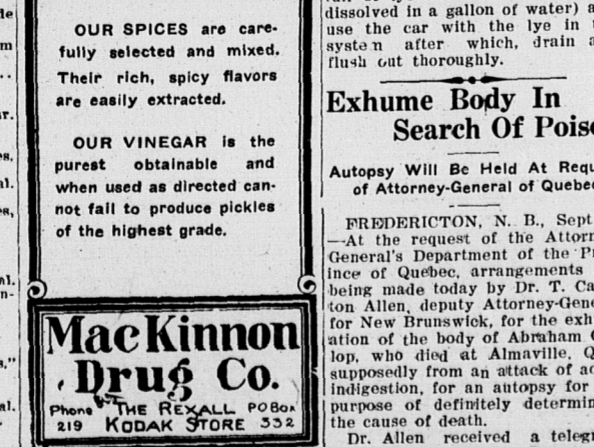

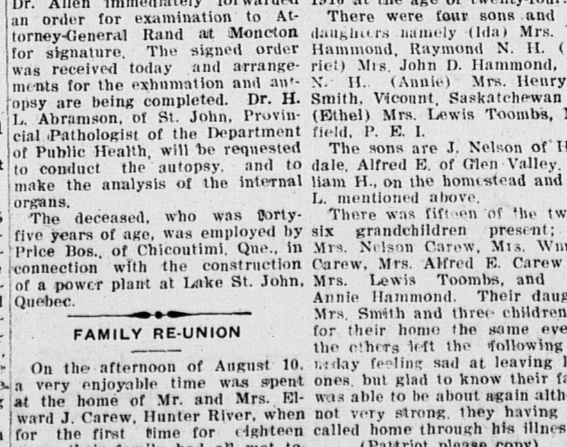

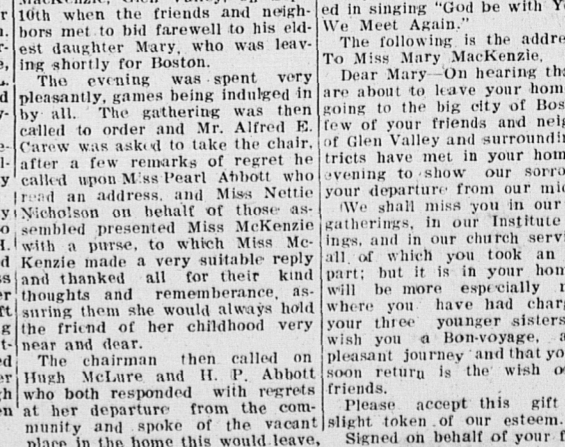
