Auditors—Lt. Col. Davison, Major Goodwill.

The Association elected Lieut. Col. Robert Brown, and Lieut. Col. S. M. Rogers, Ottawa, as representatives on the D. R. A. Council for Prince Edward Island.

AN UNEXPECTED DEATH

The many friends of Miss Florence Whitlock, eldest daughter of S. J. and Mrs. Whitlock, School street, will be surprised and pained to hear of her death which occurred as an early hour last evening, after several months of suffering, which she endured with true christian grace and patience, the end came rather unexpectedly, for until lately not only her friends, but herself entertained hopes of her recovery.

She was a general favourite not only in her home, but among a large circle of acquaintances, she was a constant member of Grace Methodist Church, a teacher in the Sunday school and a valuable member of the choir for many years.

Her death at the early age of 27 years is greatly to be regretted. Mr. and Mrs. Whitlock and the family have the sincere sympathy of their many friends in this their sore bereavement.

NEWFOUNDLAND'S BIG DEFICIT.

ST. JOHN'S, Nfld., June 2.—The colony ran behind \$150,000 in finances during the past year, according to a statement submitted to the Legislature. In addition Newfoundland is responsible for a considerable outlay on Public Works, ordered by the Bond Government without Legislative authority, due to a dead lock which existed until the recent election. Floating debt is now \$330,000.

In his farewell address to the Legislature, Sir William MacGregor expressed his regret at quitting Newfoundland, and predicted a great future for the colony. Sir William outlined a number of policies which should be adopted. These include a vigorous fishing and agricultural policy, extension of the land and wireless telegraph systems, especially in the fishing districts, revision of tariff before next winter, increased Government aid for educational purposes, concerted action against tuberculosis; extension of the colony's railway system; improved steamship service along the coast, and old age pension system. The proposed reforms have the support of the Morris Government.

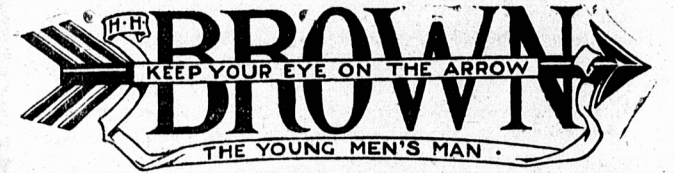

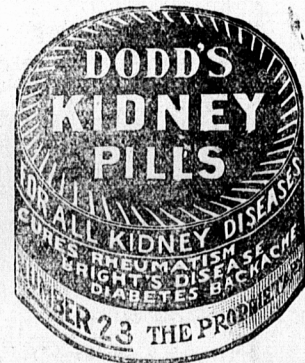


A SPLENDID GAME.

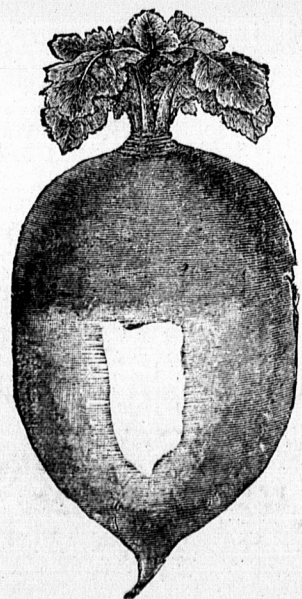
