The plumbing in the new Hospital was the work of Mr. Fred H. Trainor, all fixtures are of the latest design and is an example of expert workmanship. Brass piping was used for all water lines, this also was installed by Mr. Trainor.

All the electrical work in the new Hospital was carried out by Messrs. Chappell and Co., electrical contractors of Charlottetown. Messrs. Chappell and Co. used Northern Electric equipment, fixtures, and wire.

The tile flooring in the Hospital was laid by T. Eston and Co., who also supplied the tile flooring. Another feature is the Mastic flooring in the basement of the Hospital the work of W. H. Noonan of Montreal.

The specifications called for some very intricate ornamental iron work which seemed impossible to have done on the Island. Mr. Samuel Campbell, however, demonstrated his ability in this line and

turned out a masterpiece in iron work. The solid inch by inch posts on the stairway, and the heavier end posts on the outside railings, the whole fixed together by thousands of welds are the work of Mr. Campbell.

The plastering of the new Hospital was the work of Mr. J. J. Campbell, the well known plastering contractor. Throughout this work Mr. Campbell used Windsor Selenite Hardwall Plaster, manufactured by The Windsor Plaster Co. of Windsor, N.S.

This is another contract successfully fulfilled by Mr. J. J. Campbell, whose past accomplishments speak for themselves.

All locks in the new Hospital are of special design and made to withstand rough usage. The finished hardware and all locks were supplied by A. S. McKay of Summerside.

The sheet metal and roofing work of the new Hospital was accomplished by the well known firm of T. P. Calkin Ltd. of Kentville, N.S.
