BELLS ARRIVED—The two new bells to replace the two which are off tone in the carillon in St. Dunstan's Cathedral, have arrived and will be placed in position as soon as possible.

NEW LIBRARY BUILDING STARTED—Work on the new Legislative and Harris Memorial Library will begin this morning. McDougall and McAulay, contractors in charge of operations fenced the site for the new structure on the north side of the Market Building. The Library will be 40 by 60 feet. The height from the ground will be two stories—34 feet. Brick and interlocking tile is to be used in the construction, with concrete floors and stairways. The lavatories in the basement will be up-to-date in every respect, glazed brick and cement floors are to be used. The top storey will be used as an art gallery, the lighting coming from skylights in the roof. It is expected the building will be completed by December 15th, next. Mr. James E. Harris is the architect. When finished, the new library will be very artistic in design and will be a credit to the City of Charlottetown.

RETURNS FROM SHORT COURSE—Mr. S. T. Gallant, Supervisor of Fisheries, returned recently from Halifax, where he attended a successful course of instruction held at the Fisheries Experimental Station. The course extended over a period of six weeks, during which time the following subjects were treated:—Chemistry, Biology, Physics and Bacteriology. Practical instruction in the dressing and curing of all kinds of fish was also given, and the fishery officers are now in a position to instruct the fishermen as to the best methods of preserving fish and preparing them for the various markets. Fishermen would do well to consult the officers relative to this matter, so that they may put up a better quality of fish and thus obtain higher prices in the future than they have realized in the past. All the fishery officers in the Maritimes are obliged to take this course and write examinations thereon in order to qualify themselves for their additional duties, viz., those of Fish Inspectors.
