

POPE'S POLITE REPLY TO FRANCE

Declines to Yield the Main Point at Issue

The Papal Delegate in St. John Meets Thousands at a Reception who Kiss His Ring.

FRANCE AND THE VATICAN. PARIS July 30.—(Special)—Although it is not officially announced it can positively be affirmed that the rupture between France and the Vatican is complete.

THE POPE YIELDS NOTHING. The Holy See's lengthy reply to the French note, though most courteously worded, merely amounts to a polite statement that the Pope does not intend to infringe the stipulations of the Concordat and will not withdraw the letters calling the bishops of Dijon and Laval to Rome.

THE DELEGATE AT ST. JOHN. ST. JOHN, July 30.—Lat Knight Mgr. Sharratti held a reception in the parlor of the Bishop's Palace.

He and Bishop Casey received a raised platform; and from 7 o'clock till 10 received.

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HEAVY FIGHTING AT PORT ARTHUR

Big Battle Progressing at Hai Cheng and Hot Pursuit of the Vladivostok Squadron by Four Japanese Cruisers—Echoes of Ta Che Kiao Fight—Russian Soldiers Disgusted at the Retreat.

PORT ARTHUR NOT FALLEN. TOKYO, July 30.—(Special)—The rumored fall of Port Arthur is officially denied.

TERRIFIC THREE DAYS' FIGHT. CHEFOO, July 30.—(Special)—A junk which left Port Arthur Thursday night at midnight reports terrific fighting on land and sea which had been going on three days.

FINAL ASSAULT WAS PLANNED. A Japanese authority here says the commander of the besieging forces had planned to begin the final assault on Tuesday last.

JUNKS FOR PORT ARTHUR. The Japanese correspondents here are sending junks to the Miao Tao Islands to be ready to enter the harbor of Port Arthur immediately after the fall of the fortress.

HASTENING THE ATTACK. It is learned that the movements of the Vladivostok squadron have hastened the attack of the Japanese on Port Arthur feeling that if these vessels are allowed to go unhampered it would make a division of Togo's fleet and probably the coming out of the Russian fleet now cropped up at Port Arthur.

RUSSIAN SQUADRON SEEN. LONDON, July 30.—(Special)—A dispatch to the Central News from Tokio announces that a report from Oshima says the Vladivostok squadron was seen this morning fourteen miles off Izu.

JAPS ARE IN PURSUIT. Four Japanese warships are pursuing the Russians southward.

JAP ATTACK AT HAI CHENG. HAI CHENG, July 30.—(Special)—On Friday morning an attack on the right flank of the Russian southern army developed at 7 o'clock.

PROGRESS OF THE BATTLE. The battle opened with heavy artillery fire under cover of which the Japanese infantry advanced along the railway until eleven o'clock, when their forward movement was checked.

FIGHTING STILL GOING ON. The fighting is continued according to the last account, but the result is not known.

ECHOES OF TA CHE KIAO FIGHT. ST. PETERSBURG, July 30.—(Special)—A special from Liao Yang draws a graphic picture of the fight at Ta Che Kiao and explains that the Russians escaped from the damage of the furious Japanese bombardment by leaving the guns mostly behind the range of steep hills and concealed by high grass and trees, so the Chinese could not helicopter their position to the Japanese artillerymen.

DISGUSTED OVER THE RETREAT. Everyone was surprised and disgusted except the Russian commanders at the order to retreat.

The Russians burned everything valuable before leaving Ta Che Kiao.

[It seems probable for many reasons that stiff fighting is going on from day to day at Port Arthur, but the end is not yet over. The fighting reported near Hai Cheng now the most southern Russian position, evidently means an attack by General Oku's force west of the line of railway and between Hai Cheng and New Chwang. We shall probably soon hear of this. It is also interesting to note that four Japanese cruisers are in pursuit of the Vladivostok squadron. Whether Admiral Kamimura is still in command of the pursuing squadron we are not told. If so he has been so far the most unfortunate of Japanese commanders by sea or land during the progress of the war. The reason for this lies partly in the high speed of the Russian cruisers. Admiral Skrydloff will avoid a battle as long as possible, and has long eluded his pursuers, but he may be overtaken any day and there will be a stern reckoning. And yet it is evident that the Japanese public look for the early fall of the stronghold and we have no doubt Russia boasts of how long it can hold on.]
