CHRISTIANIA, Nov. 4 (Special)—The Norwegian explorer M. Carl Lumholtz has laid before the Geographical Society of Christiania his new scheme, which is to explore the interior of the world's second largest island, New Guinea. M. Lumholtz is a man well known to the countrymen, having three conducted expeditions to Mexico, where he has lived for a considerable time among Indian tribes.

BERLIN, Nov. 4 (Special)—One of the first problems with which the City of Berlin is now faced is that of the ways and means of public conveyance. The city, having grown more rapidly than any other capital in Europe in the last twenty years, has found during the last decade that its traffic equipment is continually behind the times, though perhaps not so much in the material as in the geographical planning of the various suburban railway, tramway, and electric underground systems of which it is composed.

Now that the great city is coming to something like a definite shape, and the scheme of a "Great Berlin" by which the suburbs shall be united with the mother-city and be placed under common control, it is felt that something must be done to co-ordinate the varied methods of public conveyance. The problem is now under the consideration of the special committee that is perorally represents Berlin, both city and suburbs.

BERLIN, Nov. 4 (Special)—The tendency of the German nobility, especially the princely houses, to show increasing regard to the navy as a career is evidently being followed by the German upper and middle classes, who in recent years have provided such a large percentage of the German army officers.

Some of these advantages are clearly set out in a plea recently published by a naval officer that the naval career should be still further popularized in Germany.

The popularity of the career is undoubtedly increasing, but so, too, is the need of officers. Hitherto only a couple of hundred candidates have been admitted to the Cadet Corps yearly, but last year the number was increased to 240, and this year the number is to be raised to 300.
