The latest news, first of all.

The Empress took away yesterday from Summerside four hundred cases of eggs.

G. S. Inman, Montague, arrived in Summerside yesterday morning by the eastern mail train.

Mrs Dr. McLeod, Charlottetown, crossed by the Empress yesterday, going to visit her daughter, Mrs Thomas at Fredericton, N. B.

Mrs Frank McDonald, Summerside and family, left by the morning train yesterday for Georgetown where they will remain till after the Christmas holidays.

One street lamp on Belmont Street has refused to do business during the dark wet night and no one seems to complain as it only accommodated a couple of families.

Mrs Harper, Tignish, reports that she slaughtered a hog the other day, seven months old, that weighed 333 lbs when dressed. This knocks out the Summerside man whose hog, as reported a few days ago, only weighed 284 lbs.

In Summerside yesterday dealers were paying twenty-five cents a dozen for eggs; eight dollars and fifty cents a ton for loose hay; four dollars and fifty cents for straw; twenty-five per bus for potatoes, forty to forty-one cents per bus for oats and eight to eight and three quarter cents per lb for pork.

Alberton dealers are paying thirty seven cents a bus for white oats and thirty-eight cents for black; twenty-one cents a doz for eggs; nineteen cents a pound for butter; nineteen cents a bus for potatoes; ten cents a lb for hedges; eight to eight and three-quarter cents a lb for pork; ten cents for turnips and eight dollars a ton for loose hay.

The Supreme Court in Summerside yesterday was occupied nearly all day with the assault case The King vs McNeill. The jury found a verdict of guilty. McQuarrie for McNeill, the Attorney General and J. H. Bell for the Crown. The King vs Murphy, an assault case, was called but not concluded when the court adjourned.

The death occurred at the residence of her daughter, Mrs Andrew Keenan, 102 Pearl Street, Bangor, Maine, of Mrs John D. Cameron, formerly of Wellington, P. E. I. She enjoyed good health up till a few days previous to her death. She was attended during her illness by her pastor Rev Father Driscoll. Father Garrity performed the funeral services and spoke highly of the good charitable qualities of the deceased. She leaves to mourn one daughter, Mrs Margaret Keenan, Bangor, Me., and two sons, Michael O'Connor, Bangor and John E. O'Connor, Carleton, P. E. I. (Summerside Journal and Pioneer please copy.)

Geo M. Price, one of Summerside's best known and most deservedly respected and oldest citizens, passed away yesterday at ten a.m. in his 88th year. Up to within ten days of his death the deceased was hale and hearty, when he was stricken with paralysis from which he did not recover. Mr Price was born at Bedecue and when a young man was engaged in the coasting business, principally between Summerside and Miramichi, when Summerside was only known as Green Shore. Later he began farming just a little east of the town. For many years he delivered milk to the people of Summerside and many of the poor will long remember his full measure of milk, his happy smile and pleasant greeting, ever the same in the midwinter storm or in midsummer, never complaining under any circumstances. He leaves to mourn his aged widow and one daughter, Mrs Cumess, Maptapa, Mass, who was called to be with him at his death bed the funeral will take place on Sunday at two p.m. and will be under the management of the Masonic Order of which he was an honored member for many years.

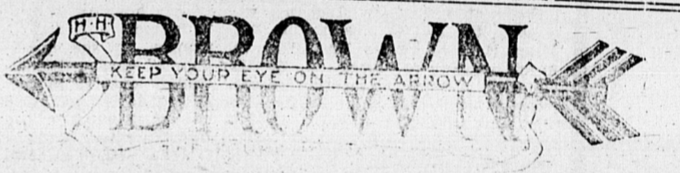

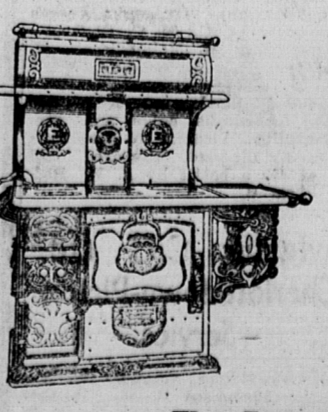
