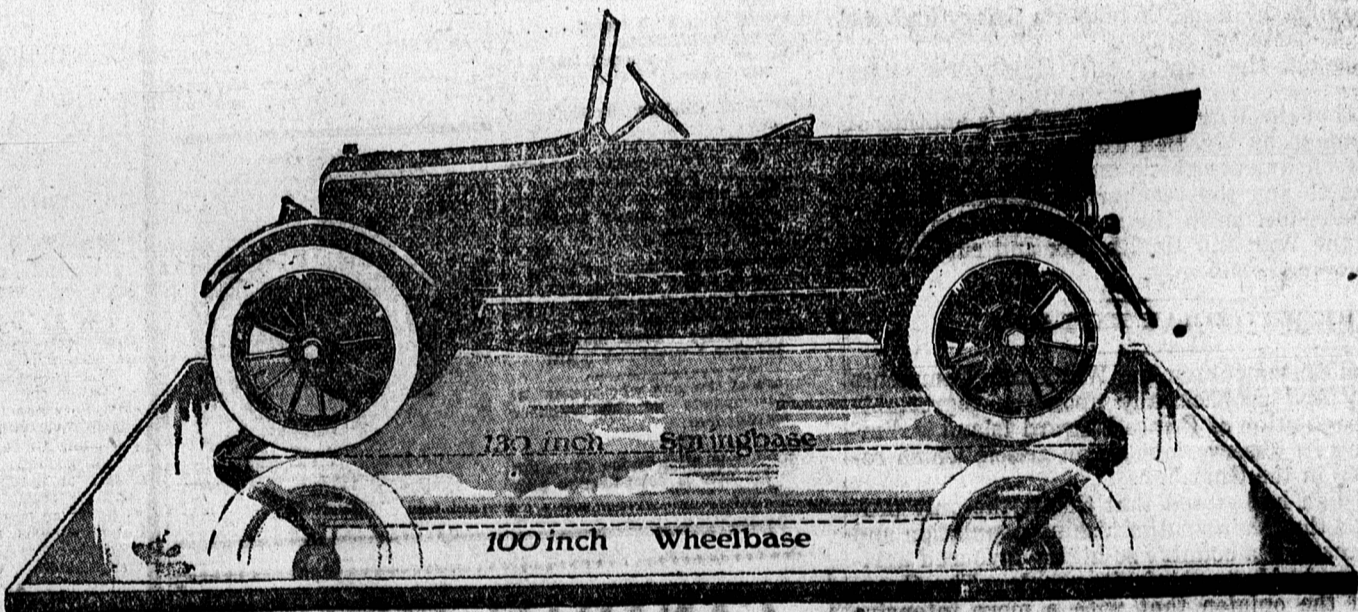

NO "BOOST IN" THE PRICE OF COAL TO BE MADE

ST. LOUIS, Mo., Oct. 31.—The operators will use all their power to prevent any individual among them from increasing the price of coal, according to a statement made by Thomas Brewster, head of the coal operators' scale committee here today. Mr. Brewster also stated that so far as is known the attempts to take advantage of the present situation to boost the price of coal have been few.

"After the withdrawal of the price control, the prices of the higher grades advanced slightly and the lower grades declined considerably and the general average of prices are below those in effect at the time the price control was withdrawn," he said.

Mr. Brewster made the above statement in answer to information that the miners had made claims that the operators had been permitted to increase coal prices although the war time agreement was held to be still binding.

WILD SCENES AT BAPTIST CONVENTION IN OTTAWA

OTTAWA, October 30.—Rev. J. Henderson, of Eglington Baptist church, Toronto, was the centre of wild scenes at last night's meeting of the Ontario and Quebec Baptist Conference. He refused to sit down when told to do so by the president, Rev. O. S. C. Wallace, and insisted on speaking. He could not be heard, however, for many of the delegates, including several venerable ministers rose to their feet and shouted at the top of their voice, "Throw him out, and 'sit down.'" Finally his friends gathered around him and induced him to take his seat.

The cause of the trouble was an address given by E. H. Scammell, assistant deputy minister of "Soldiers' Civil Re-establishment, who is a member of the First Baptist church, Ottawa. He spoke on "The Church and the Returned Soldier." Mr. Scammell asked did they think that a returned soldier, after his experiences at the front, would sing: "I would not breathe for worldly joy; Or to increase my worldly goods. My future days or powers employ." To spread a sounding name abroad."

A great commotion then occurred, several interruptions and others trying to speak at the same time. There were cries of "heresy," "lies" and "blasphemy."

Mr. Henderson rose to his feet and shouting at the top of his voice said they certainly could expect soldiers to sing such hymns. He had found that soldiers were held, kept and drawn together by the old-fashioned God and the old-fashioned Christ.

The president: "I call on you to sit down."

Mr. Henderson: "Before I sit down I will renounce this blasphemy and heresy."

It was then that the trouble started and for several minutes many tried to speak at the same time. Mr. Henderson finished what he had to say, despite the repeated protests of the president. After Mr. Scammell had finished his address, Mr. Henderson again rose and tried to address the meeting, but Dr. Wallace said he would listen to nothing but an apology from Mr. Henderson.

Mr. Henderson: "I apologize to the chair only."

The president: "Then sit down."

In the course of his address, Mr. Scammell made reference to the returned soldiers who formerly were church workers and who did not now go to any church. He suggested that they form a department with head-

quarters at Toronto, for the Christian re-establishment of soldiers.

At the conclusion of the address, Mr. Scammell was loudly applauded.

Dr. Wallace remarking: "Whatever mistakes you have made in speaking tonight, and you have made mistakes, are forgiven and forgotten."
