

# THE DAILY GUARDIAN'S WAR MAP



## THE TWO SOUTH AFRICAN REPUBLICS!

The above map, which is a complete representation of the face of the two South African Republics, will enable readers to form an adequate idea of the extent of ground necessary to be covered by the British troops in the event of hostilities, and of the physical features of the terrain which has again assumed so much interest in the eyes of politicians and soldiers. The map shows a country thirty-

six times as large as the section of the Province of Quebec shown as a comparison.

The map shows the positions which might be defended by the Boers along the line taken in Jameson's raid - the position between Newcastle and Volksrust, including the Majuba Hill, Laing's Nek, and the tunnel on the railway

where the line enters Transvaal territory. It shows the entire railway system of the two republics, ann from Delagoa Bay on Portuguese territory, with the lines projected and in course of construction. It also indicates the forts at Pretoria and Johannesburg, of which no detailed information exists in this country outside of the Intelligence Department of the War Office.
