**JAPAN'S BIG WARSHIP EXCELS DREADNAUGHT**

The Largest Battleship in the World Will be Launched in Japan, She is Built on Plans of British Ship.

LONDON, Nov. 15.—According to the Tokio correspondent of the Daily Telegraph the Satsuma the largest battleship in the world, which is to be launched in Japan today, embodies all the lessons of the last war. The woodwork on board has been reduced to a minimum. She is fitted with elaborate fire apparatus and her upper works are kept as clear of topmasts as possible. Her details in the main follow those of the British battleship Dreadnought, whose steaming capacity she is expected to exceed. The correspondent says there is every reason to believe that

the British and Japanese admiralities exchanged plans and ideas previous to the construction of this warship. As the Satsuma has been built by Japanese labor exclusively her launching will be regarded as a great historical event and the emperor and crown prince of Japan will be present.

**FOR PURE ELECTIONS.**

Sir,—As one who has labored with voice and pen in the cause of electoral purity, I hail with delight the movement for an organisation by the venerable Dr. Jenkins. If he succeeds in bringing about a reformation his name will deserve to go down in history as one of our greatest public benefactors. United action cannot be taken a day too soon, for even now the sleuthhounds of corruption are on the scent of the susceptible Island elector.

While I agree with the Doctor as to the deplorable results of political bribery and corruption, I am at variance with him as to one point of his proposed remedy. I cannot see why it is necessary in the cause of reform that an honest elector should be compelled to vote for a candidate whom he would be afraid to trust with power. Between canvassing and compulsory voting there is much in common. Compulsion is the most objectionable feature of the personal canvass. The whole filthy business from beginning to end is an interference with the independence of the elector. Besides visits from the candidates, he has to run the gauntlet of several underlayers, and as polling day approaches there are alternate threats and coaxings in the case of the weak and poor; the final scene is often a brutal exhibition of debauchery and physical force.

Compulsory voting, in my opinion, an inconsistent measure, as a means of reform, repugnant to the elector's conscientious convictions and an arbitrary infringement of individual liberty. The penalties for canvassing should be fines and disfranchisement, extending to the voter as well as the candidate, and where this method is enforced you strike at the very root of the mischief.

The disgusting spectacle of crime which the courts reveal should cause the most hardened to shudder with fear for the future of this young nation, and arouse the most timid to action. Any coward can drift with the current, but to stem the current of corruption will require courage and patriotism. Our Island home is now ringing with praises of two young heroes for their unselfish Christian courage in risking their lives to save their fellows. Will a saving remnant of our politicians be prepared to stake their political lives for the welfare of the country? If there are such, let them come out and be separate from those who, with false conceptions of life would rather have the applause of the multitude than an honorable defeat, which may contain the elements of true heroism.

Some of the men who climbed into public life of Canada to-day are more deserving of a brand of infamy than a badge of honor. Corruption, graft and greed in political life will also permeate our social life, to be followed by weakness and decay. This is no idle dream but a statement that can easily be verified from history.

**VERMONT KEEPS DEATH PENALTY**

MONTEPELIER, Vt., Nov. 15.—Notwithstanding the agitation of a year ago in opposition to the hanging of Mary Rogers, the lower branch of the legislature today, by a vote of 79 to 140 refused to pass to the third reading a bill abolishing capital punishment.

The debate on the bill lasted three hours, and nearly all the leaders participated. An effort was made to substitute a provision in the bill making imprisonment for life the punishment for a woman convicted of murder in the first degree, but this was also voted down.
