Halifax Dec. 15.—The Halifax produce market is stocked about as it usually is at this time of the year. Eggs are selling wholesale at 20c., and the supply, which comes chiefly from Prince Edward Island, is fairly liberal. Butter prices are unchanged, compared with two weeks ago, but dealers are not prepared to predict what the conditions will be two weeks hence. The west rules Halifax prices in butter. Large importations of dairy are being made, and some creamery comes from the same quarter. Cheese has advanced from 11 1/2c to 12c during the past couple of weeks.

Heavy beef, of good quality, is hard to obtain. While scarce, light stock, of somewhat inferior grade, is in good supply. Turkeys are quoted, wholesale, at 11c to 13c, and geese at 60c and 70c.

Oats during the past couple of weeks have stiffened, though there is no quotable change in the price. P. E. Island oats are here in good supply—rather larger than usual.

P. E. Island potatoes have not come forward in as large quantities as in some former seasons. No vessels have yet arrived to lay up in the stream, all the cargoes in port being at wharves discharging. Large lots sell at 25c. and smaller at 30c.

Hay is firmer than two weeks ago, at the price then quoted, and one dealer mentioned a figure 50c. per ton higher than the last quotation published.
