RAILWAY AND STREET CAR ACCIDENTS

Deaf Mute Farmer Killed on I. C. R.; Collision in Tennessee Kills Six, Injures Thirty Collision in North Carolina, Kills, Three, Injures Nineteen

MONROE, Oct. 18-(Special)-While walking on the I. C. R. track this morning Stephen Steves, a deaf mute, was struck by the Maritime Express and was instantly killed.

GREENSBORO, N. C., Oct. 18-(Special)-A passenger train on the Southern Railway last night crashed into a freight train at Radd, near here.

Three persons were killed and nineteen were injured. CHATTANOOGA, TENN., Oct. 18, (Special)-In a street car collision early this morning, six persons were killed and ten were seriously injured.

MANY VICTIMS MEET DEATH IN THE WATER

Three Members of G. T. P. Survey Party Drowned in B. C. Danish Ship Wrecked on Scottish Coast and Twenty of the Crew Drowned

VANCOUVER, Oct. 18 (Special) - Three members of the Grand Trunk Pacific survey party were drowned, October 14, in the Lacombe Rapids, on the Fraser River.

LONDON, Oct. 18-(Special)-The Danish steamer Alfred Eidsvaer has been wrecked off Cape Point, near Stab's Head, Scotland.

The steamer went ashore last night and twenty of the crew were drowned. The lifeboat which spent the night looking for the survivors had a narrow escape.
