**PRAHA, CZECHOSLOVAKIA, Oct. 5—(AP)**—The cabinet economic committee voted today to recommend devaluation of the crown by between 10.6 and 16 per cent. in gold content.

Under the recommendation, which was to be made before the full cabinet, the value of the Czech crown would be regulated by the National Bank which would have an equalization fund of 900,000,000 crowns from devaluation profits.
