P. R. ASSOCIATION ANNUAL MEETING

Begun Yesterday at Kensington Range Charlottetown--

Attendance Not So Large as Usual--Eager Competition Among the Marksmen--Shooters From the Battleship Take Part.

The annual Prize Meeting of the Prince Edward Island Provincial Rifle Association commenced yesterday morning on Kensington Range.

Major A. A. Bartlett, Secretary Treasurer of the Association is upon the range, as are also the members of the Executive Committee—Lt. Col. D. Stewart, Lt. Col. Davidson, and Capt. J. A. McDonald. The meeting will last for three days.

There was not as large an attendance of marksmen on the opening day as is usually seen at the annual meetings, but there is likely to be a fair attendance, and eager competition.

Among the shooters yesterday were several marksmen from the battleship Dominion, who expressed their pleasure at being able to have a shot.

The wind blew strongly in the rear of the marksmen in the morning and the light was variable and baffling. In the afternoon there was a light shower which did not improve the conditions.

The arrangements will regard to targets are the same as last year only six being provided, but the Executive kept things moving rapidly, and at the close of the day were fully an hour ahead of schedule time. The Lee-Enfield Rifles are again used, and only three men—the members of the Prince of Wales College Cadet team—ventured to use the new Ross Rifle. A number of the men are using the Peddie sight, but the majority are using the bar and line.

Despite the unfavorable weather the shooting was of a high standard.

Sgt. J. A. Moore of Pownal making a possible of 35, and a number of men made over 30. During the Hodgson match in the afternoon, conditions were worse and the scores were not so high. A drizzling rain fell at intervals and made the sighting very difficult. Here, however, Capt. J. M. Jones of Bisleigh fame, who throughout the day did his usual remarkable steady shooting, made 33 in a downpour of rain, and won the match. The Bankers' match was also concluded last evening. In the first stage of this match 500 yards the highest score was 34 by R. W. Chandler, and in the second stage at 600 yards, Lieut. Beer made a possible of 35. The totals at this match were not available last night. Today the Prowse match and the special Tyro match, consisting of three stages will be shot. Major Leigh is this year Range Officer, and the efficient Secretary Major Bartlett is again at his post.
